



The first Chicano Commencement was established in 1970 as a celebration for Chicanos graduating from San José State College. Its roots can be traced from the 1968 and 1969 walkouts and protests by Chicano students and Chicano community members against San José State administration. At that time, during the era of the Civil Rights Movement, Chicano students felt misrepresented by the College and that the Chicano community's needs were not being met. When demands for change were refused, Chicano students and community members walked out of the College's annual commencement ceremony held at Spartan Stadium and as a result, decided to hold their own commencement, a Chicano Commencement. After thirty-seven years. the days of the walkouts have long since passed and the name of the institution has changed to San Jose Staté University. As the first public institution of higher learning on the west coast, we continue to move forward to new goals and accomplishments. This year we celebrate a milestone achievement as San Jose Staté University reaches its 150th anniversary. Filled with rich diversity and culture working in harmony, our campus exemplifies what a first-rate institution should be. We are not the best because we are the first; we are the first because we are the best. In this tradition, Chicano Commencement continues to be held as a ceremony that recognizes Chicanos who have achieved their personal dreams, and those of their families. This annual event has grown in the numbers and has seen an increase of students who represent the diversity of Latin America. For many of these students they are the first in their families to graduate from a university and pursue a professional career. These graduates are future researchers, doctors, engineers, social workers, lawyers, teachers, politicians, and many other important individuals that currently do a service to the communities they work for. DR. MARIA LUISA ALANIZ


Professor and Chair, is most enthusiastic about her role teaching and advising students in the Teacher Education program. The diversity of students brings rich life experiences into the classroom, she says. "They bring a passion for teaching, a love for children...they make teaching an enriching experience." Professor Alaniz is proud to play a role in a Teacher Education program that puts diversity at the center of its training of future teachers and leaders of education. "We're not just about teaching content, but engaging in public policy, training advocates, focusing on social justice issues," says Alaniz. "We're producing teachers who really care about kids." She enjoys challenging her students, asking "What kind of teacher are you going to be? Are you going to teach in a microcosm, or will you strive to be an agent of change?" Professor Alaniz' research background makes her especially well-suited to such a complete program. She has worked in various capacities to promote public health advocacy in communities of color. As a Study Director and Co-Principal Investigator at the Prevention Research Center in Berkeley, she published extensively on issues of alcohol availability and social problems in urban communities. Professor Alaniz has also served in numerous local community organizations including the Mexican American Community Service Agency, the California Latinos United for a Healthy California Board, the Praxis Project/Robert Wood Johnson Foundation funded initiative, the Santa Clara County Child Advocate Board, and the Santa Clara County Violence Prevention Planning Council.Her more recent work reflects on her own journey from migrant farmworker family to university professor, and also on the healing power of "stories as spiritual medicine." Her hobbies include hiking, travel and reading.

He has also done many of voice-overs for Univision Channel 67 and La Preciosa radio station promoting local business.

DR. GILBERTO CONCHAS
GUEST SPEAKER

Dr. Conchas is a Senior Program Officer, U.S. Special Initiatives, with the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. He received his Ph.D. in sociology in 1999 from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. From 1999 to 2004, he served as an assistant professor at the Harvard Graduate School of Education. In 2004, he joined the faculty at the University of California, Irvine as an associate professor of education and Chancellor's Fellow with joint appointments in Chicano/Latino Studies and Sociology. Dr. Conchas has pursued three broad areas of study in the sociology of education that include urban education, immigration and education, and social policy and reform. His work has appeared in numerous academic journals that include the Harvard Education Review, Teachers College Record, New Directions for Youth Development, the Journal of Education for Students Placed at Risk, and Research in Sociology of Education. He most recently published The Color of Success: Race and High-Achieving Urban Youth (2006) and Small School and Urban Youth: Size, Culture and Personalization (2008).

VICTOR VILLASEÑOR

Born in the barrio of Carlsbad, California in 1940, Victor Villaseñor was raised on a ranch four miles north in Oceanside. Since his parents were born in Mexico, Villaseñor spoke only Spanish until beginning school. After years of facing language and cultural barriers, heavy discrimination and a reading problem, later diagnosed as dyslexia, Victor dropped out of high school his junior year and moved to Mexico. There he discovered a wealth of Mexican art, literature, music, that helped him recapture and understand the dignity and richness of his heritage.

Victor returned to the U.S. at the age of 20. He began to feel the old frustration and rage return as he witnessed again the disregard toward poor and uneducated people and especially toward the Mexicans. Then a chance encounter with James Joyce's Portrait Of An Artist As A Young Man, changed Victor's life. It awakened a desire to confront through literature the problems associated with his cultural heritage that continued to plaque him.


After producing nine novels, 65 short stories, and receiving 265 rejections Villaseñor sold his first novel, Macho!, which the Los Angeles Times compared to the best of Steinbeck. This began a journey that would eventually lead to the publication of the national bestseller, Rain of Gold. Published in seven languages and used by thousands of teachers and school systems across the nation as required reading, Rain Of Gold tells the story of Victor's family, taking the reader from war-torn Mexico during the Revolution to the present day.

Villaseñor's body of works include a number of nonfiction books which are all used in schools throughout the country: The trilogy Wild Steps Of Heaven, Rain of Gold, and Thirteen Senses, Jury: The People vs Juan Corona, Machol, and Walking Stars, a collection of short stories written especially to inspire young people. Burro Genius, the first book of the second trilogy, released July 2004, is a national bestseller, and a Pulitzer Prize finalist. Victor also wrote the screenplay for The Ballad of Gregorio Cortez, starring Edward James Olmos. Villaseñor's acclaimed written works, as well as his inspiring lectures, have earned him numerous awards and endorsements, including the Founding John Steinbeck Chair appointment.

A gifted and accomplished speaker, Victor Villaseñor, in his candid and heartfelt manner, brings a fresh perspective to a number of universal themes, including pride in heritage, the strength of family, world peace, the power of the written word, and dedication to education and personal achievement.

Villaseñor's commitment to world peace and harmony is demonstrated through "Snow Goose Global Thanksgiving", his non-profit organization established to promote peace throughout the world. His self-published book, Snow Goose Global Thanksgiving, describes a simple philosophy toward that eventuality.

Victor Villaseñor continues to live on the ranch where he was raised.
