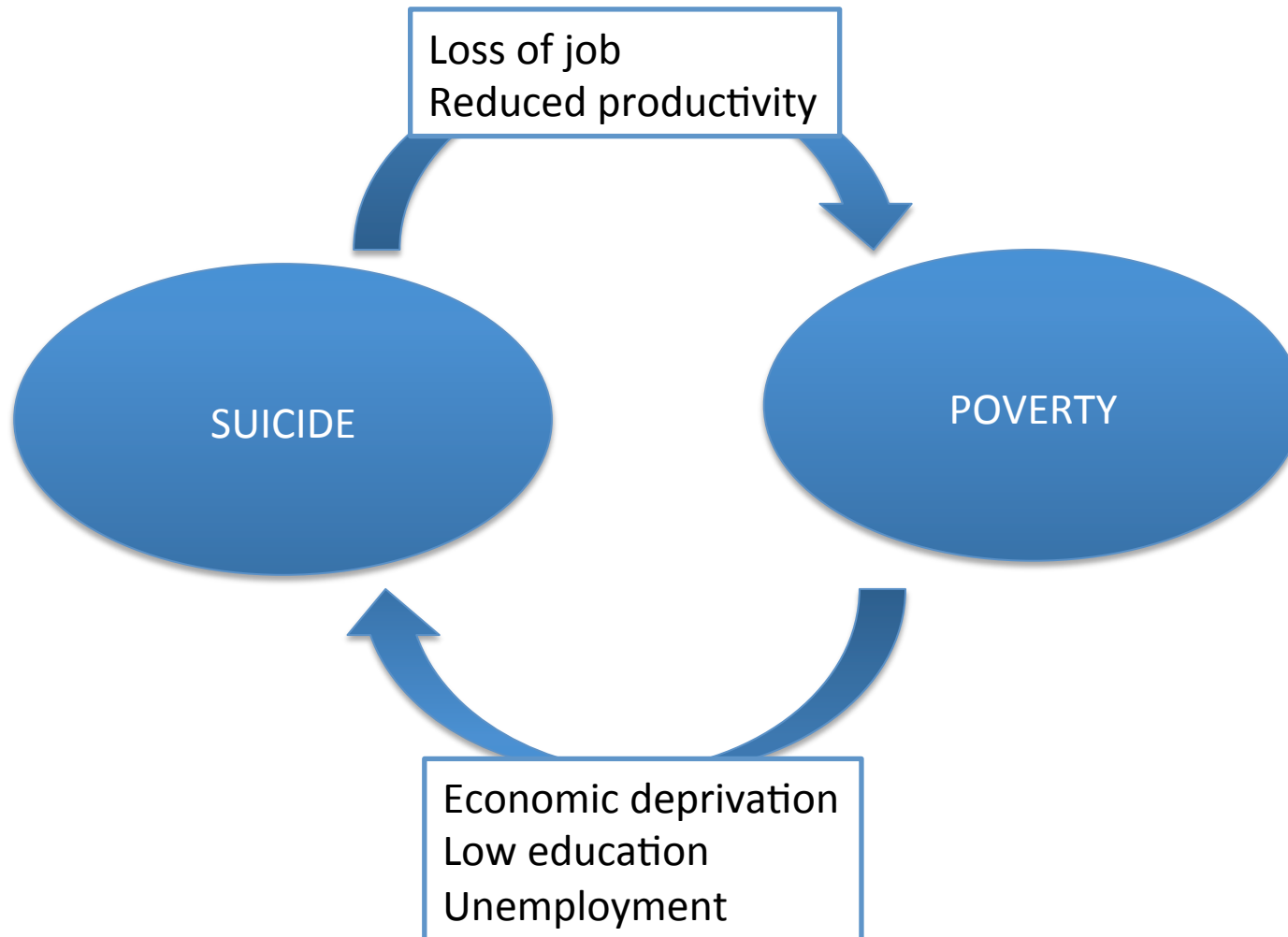

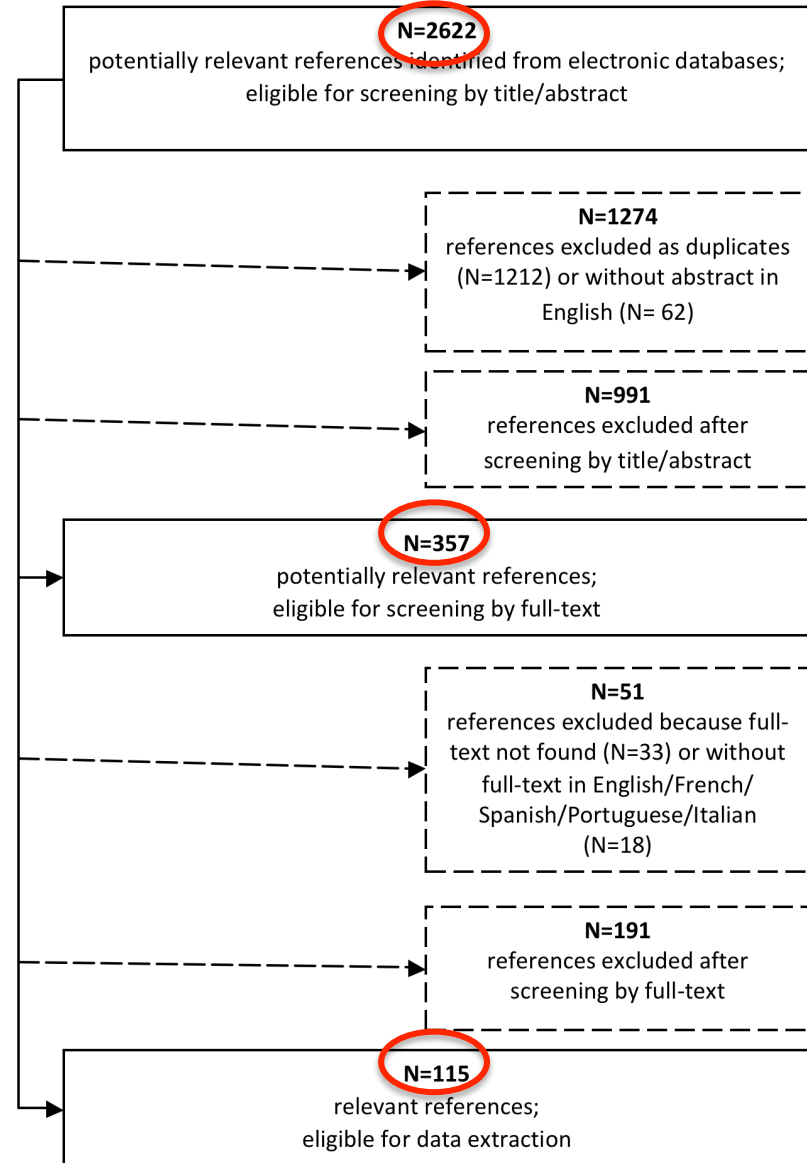

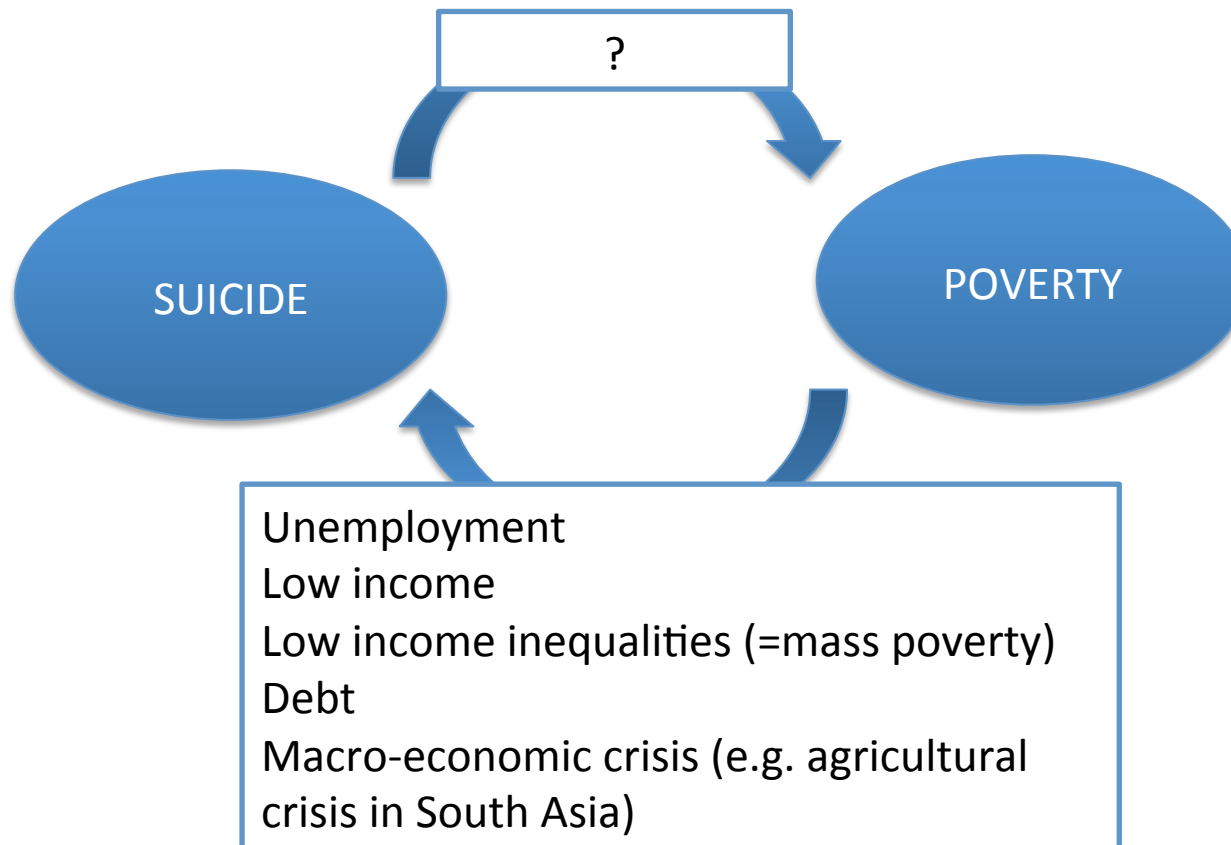

Causal chain

Only those studies where **causality was clearly identified** in the methodology:

- 26 which looked at the correlation between poverty and suicide
- 5 which used poverty as a control variable and
- 26 which considered poverty within a multivariate regression analysis

Only the pathways **from poverty to suicide**



Next steps

- Robust research on suicide and poverty in LMICs
- Evaluation of the impact of interventions on poverty on suicide
- Evaluation of the impact of interventions on suicide on poverty
