



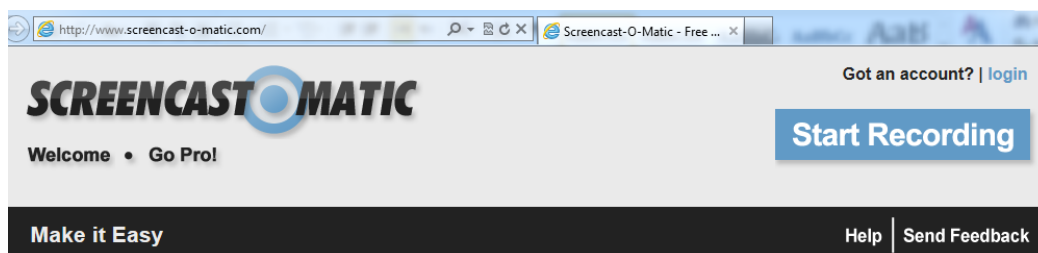

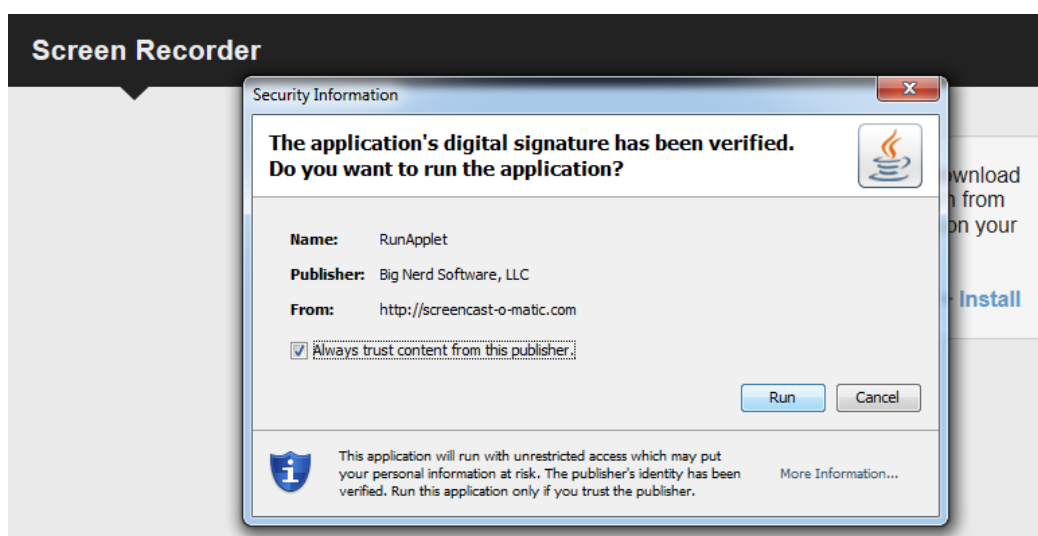
### Guide to using Screen Cast O Matic

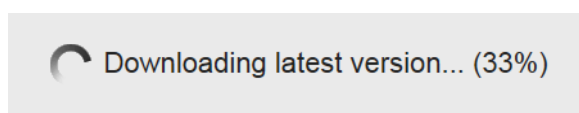
You do not need to log in to create a Screen Cast. Just click on Start Recording



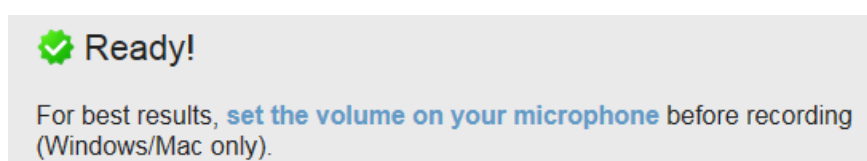
You may get the following...if so just click Run



Allow this download to finish...



Then you should see this. Check your microphone settings if you need to:-

This is the box you will see each time you click Start Recording.



You can drag it to fit around whatever you would like to show, demonstrate, discuss or point to on your screen recording.

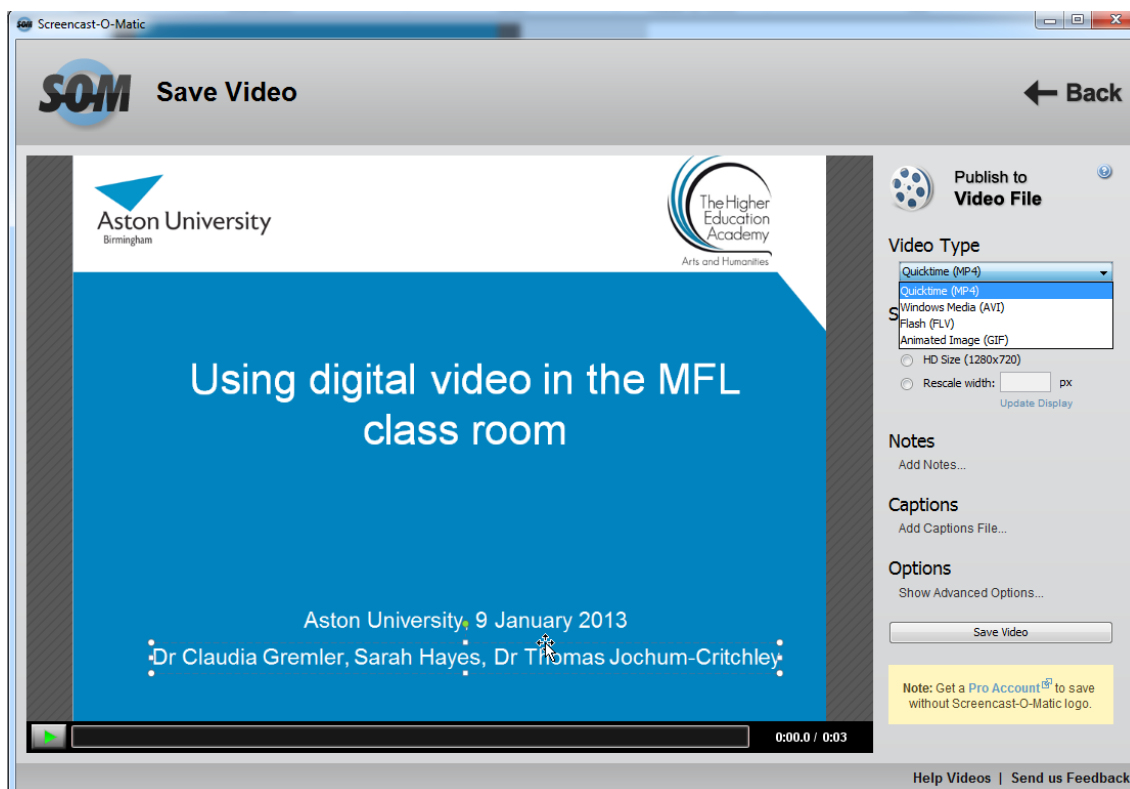
When you click this button  you will be given a countdown of a few seconds....
