Private Act.

An Act to repeal the twenty-first section of "The Manchester Unity of Oddfellows Act, 1874."

[*Assented to, November 16th, 1887.*]

WHEREAS it is expedient to repeal the twenty-first section of "The Manchester Unity of Oddfellows Act, 1874," which limits the number of Friendly or Benefit Societies to which members of the Independent Order of Oddfellows Manchester Unity Friendly Society, in South Australia may belong, and also limits the amount payable in case of sickness to members belonging to more than one other Friendly or Benefit Society—Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor of the said province, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows :

1. The twenty-first section of "The Manchester Unity of Oddfellows Act, 1874," is hereby repealed, but such repeal shall not confer any rights or impose any liabilities in respect of any matters accrued before the passing of this Act.

Repeal of the 21st section of "The Manchester Unity of Oddfellows Act, 1874."

2. This Act may be cited for all purposes as "The Manchester Unity of Oddfellows Amendment Act, 1887."

Short title.

3. Any nomination made by any member in pursuance of section 18 of the "Manchester Unity of Oddfellows Act, 1874," shall, for the purposes of the said Act, be deemed to be revoked by the subsequent marriage of the member making such nomination.

Marriage to revoke nomination.
