The tentative total number of degree recipients for 1969-70 was noted by Mr. Durrie as 2,449 (1,681 bachelors, 569 masters, 58 professional, and 141 doctors), it being pointed out that this number includes those who completed requirements last summer as well as at the end of Semester I. Dr. Travelstead also commented on the increased number of persons being awarded the degree of Bachelor of University Studies.

It was moved by Mrs. Mapel, seconded by Dr. Bradbury, that the foregoing list, including the three honorary degree recipients, be approved for the granting of the appropriate degrees, subject (in the case of the bachelors and masters) to the satisfactory completion of academic requirements. Carried.

* * * * *

Upon the recommendation of President Heady and Vice President Smith, it was moved by Dr. Bradbury, seconded by Mr. Wolf, that architects be appointed for the following projects:

Appointment of Architects

Lawrence A. Garcia for remodeling of the center section of Mesa Vista Hall; The Environmental Collaborative for remodeling of the IBM Building for occupancy by the Technology Application Center and the Work Incentive Program (both of them agencies of ISRAD); and Long & Waters for remodeling the building at 108 Cornell, SE, recently purchased with agency funds to house the Tamarind Institute. The motion noted with approval the use of architects who have not previously done work for the University. Carried. It was noted by Dr. Smith that these recommendations had not come through the Campus Planning Committee inasmuch as no exterior design changes were involved.

* * * * *

Upon recommendation of Dean Stone and the Medical School, it was moved by Dr. Wilkinson, seconded by Dr. Bradbury, that the existing agreement between the Regents of the University and the Hope Medical Center (in the Estancia Valley) be extended for a term of one year, beginning August 1, 1970, and ending July 31, 1971. Carried.

Extension of Agreement with Hope Medical Center

Dr. Wilkinson observed that this was a fine project but said that unfortunately there is a trend to bypass the nursing function for the fewer and fewer registered nurses being produced in the country and to let them take over professional non-nursing duties, thus further reducing the number of nurses. He noted that only about 20 per cent of the young women who have entered UNM in the field of nursing have graduated with a bachelor's degree, and he stressed the need to search for an improvement in the situation to help remedy the desperate national shortage of nurses. It was suggested that Dr. Wilkinson might discuss the problem with Dean Stone in his new capacity as Vice President for Health Sciences.

Contracts with
Dental Schools
Outside WICHE
Area

Mr. MacGregor appeared before the Regents to ask approval of contracts with four dental schools outside the WICHE area. He said that the initial contracts, drawn in 1961, with Baylor University, Creighton University, and the University of Kansas City (now the University of Missouri at Kansas City), had provided that payment would be made by the State of New Mexico to the three dental schools at the rate of \$1,500 per year for each New Mexico resident admitted to each of the schools, these amounts to cover a portion of the cost of instruction. The schools agreed at that time to apply a portion of the total to each student's tuition -- \$450 per year for Baylor, \$400 per year for the other two schools. Since that time, Mr. MacGregor said, tuitions have increased considerably, and by direction of the State Board of Finance the amount to go to each participating institution has been raised from \$1,500 to \$2,000 per year for each New Mexico resident admitted. Mr. MacGregor noted that Washington University in St. Louis has been added to the three participating institutions noted above. Mr. MacGregor said further that of this annual amount of \$2,000, Baylor, Creighton, and Washington -- all private institutions -- would apply \$750 per year to each student's tuition, while the University of Missouri at Kansas City would apply \$800, the amount of that institution's non-resident tuition at the present time, it being understood that this amount would be increased if the non-resident tuition rate increased further.

In reply to a question from Mr. Wolf, Mr. MacGregor said that there was a separate appropriation from the Legislature to the University of New Mexico for administering this program. During the 1969-70 year, he said, 72 New Mexico residents attended dental schools under the program (40 at Baylor, 22 at Kansas City, 2 at Creighton, and 8 at WICHE schools).

It was moved by Dr. Bradbury, seconded by Dr. Wilkinson, that the contracts with the four schools be approved. Carried.

* * * * *

Release of Pledge
and Hypothecation
of Long-Term Lease
re Woodward Estate

A letter from Mr. Sloan, University attorney, requested the Regents to execute a "Release of Pledge and Hypothecation of Long Term Lease" in connection with the Hugh Woodward estate. Mr. Sloan's letter explained that Mr. Woodward had caused his corporation, the Southwestern Construction Co., to pledge a lease with the Chrysler Motor Corporation to the University to secure the University in connection with its lease of the property on Monte Vista or University Boulevard against possible loss by reason of Mr. Woodward having given a partial mortgage to the Springer Transfer Company. The mortgage has now been paid, he said, and the Woodward estate wishes a release of the pledge.

It was moved by Mr. Wolf, seconded by Dr. Wilkinson, that the

officers of the Board be authorized to execute the "Release of Pledge and Hypothecation of Long Term Lease" relative to the Hugh Woodward estate. Carried.

* * * * *

Mr. Steven Berlin, attorney from the firm of Franks & deVesty, appeared before the Regents on behalf of the Dikewood Retirement and Benefit Plan to explain the following resolution: Dikewood Resolu-
tion

1. Dikewood Retirement and Benefit Plan is Lessee of certain property in University Research Park which it has subleased to Dikewood Corporation, a Texas corporation. Said Lessee is contemplating dissolving and desires the consent of the University to an assignment of Lessee's interest in said Lease and Sublease to a new corporation or other entity, such consent to include a release of the Lessee's liability and substitution therefor of the Assignee's liability.

2. The president or vice president and the secretary or assistant secretary of the Regents of the University of New Mexico are hereby authorized and directed to execute any necessary consent, release, or other document effecting this change upon certification:

(1) by the University's Comptroller that the Assignee of the Lessee, the Sublessee and the Sublessee's guarantor have adequate financial resources and that the security of the University as Lessor will not be impaired thereby; and

(2) upon approval by the University's attorneys of the form and legal sufficiency of said documents including, but not limited to, non-waiver of any provision requiring the University's consent to assignment.

Mr. Berlin said that the Dikewood Plan is to be liquidated because the Dikewood Corporation has merged with TRACOR, it being noted that TRACOR unconditionally guarantees Dikewood's performance under the sublease. One of the conditions of the merger, he said, was that the Dikewood Retirement and Benefit Plan was to be liquidated, with July 1 being chosen as the time to make the transfer to a new corporation, a real estate investment trust. Mr. Berlin said that it was desirable to transfer the real estate assets of the Plan to the new trust on July 1 and to transfer the Plan's interest as lessee under the base lease and as landlord under the sublease. He said that it was his understanding that TRACOR's unconditional guarantee would carry over and that there would be sufficient assets in the investment trust along with the guarantee.

The following is a transcript of part of the discussion which followed:

Mr. Ortega: The problem I see is that no one really is going to exercise his discretion as to whether or not the University should consent to the assignment on the basis of the basic reason for the Research Park in the first place.

Mr. Berlin: A problem with regard to the use of the premises might mean an amendment to the lease or some kind of written assurance that the tenant has been and will continue to live within the concept of a Research Park.

Mr. Ortega: I suppose it was research of a kind, but I understood that there was a mutual fund.

Mr. Berlin: This was moved out of the building.

Mr. Wolf: Would you have any objection to a conditional paragraph of non-waiver of any breach that has taken place up to this time?

Mr. Berlin: No, none at all.

Mr. Ortega: And the submission to the Regents in some way or to the Administration of a determination whether or not we will consent to the assignment after we . . .

Mr. Berlin: Perhaps it would be sufficient for your purpose if we add a clause to the resolution which directs counsel for the Regents to determine prior to approval that the lease has not been breached and that the activity will be compatible.

Mr. Ortega: That would help some.

Mr. Wolf: That's the sort of thing that I'm looking for, I think. I wouldn't want our consent to the substitution of the lessee to be construed in any manner to waive any rights as to any breach that may have taken place up to this point. I think that it might. And so I'd like to have it specifically stated in the resolution that we're not waiving any rights the Regents may have as lessor, although we will allow our consent to be given to the assignment as certified by these two officials so long as there's no waiver of any rights that we have under the lease at this point.

Mr. Ortega: I think that would correct the problem.

Mr. Wolf: With the amendment that I stated earlier as an

additional paragraph to the resolution, I move its adoption. I make this motion with the hope that the Administration will see fit to have the Comptroller and the attorney for the University confer rather extensively with the President of the Regents prior to the certification that's being given.

Dr. Bradbury: I second the motion.

(The motion carried unanimously.)

* * * * *

Mr. Arthur Blumenfeld, Associate Director of ISRAD, appeared before the Regents to explain that the University has entered into contracts with the New Mexico Department of Health and Social Services and the Model Cities Agency of the City of Albuquerque for about \$650,000 to organize and operate (for a limited time) a day care and child development program for 500 children residing in the Model Cities Area, the program being fully financed from federal sources. He noted the desirability of establishing five centers, each for 100 children, in the communities comprising the Model Cities area (South Barelás, Santa Barbara-Martineztown, South Broadway, John Marshall, and South San José). Sites, he said, are presently available for lease at three of the five areas, and discussions are under way to identify the remaining sites. It was Mr. Blumenfeld's suggestion that portable buildings be leased as the most suitable manner of providing physical facilities. He estimated that a total of 32,000 to 36,000 square feet of building space would be required, with leases of approximately \$136,000 for the first year. He said that it was his expectation that the buildings would be transferred to the Community Corporation at the time it is determined that the Corporation is capable of administering the project, this decision to be made jointly with the State Department of Health and Social Services.

Dr. Smith expressed his opinion that Board of Educational Finance and State Board of Finance approval was not required since no appropriated or other University funds were involved.

In response to a question from Mr. Ortega, Mr. Blumenfeld said that the appropriate kinds of liability insurance will be acquired with respect to the children, the staff, and the facilities.

Mr. Blumenfeld assured the Regents that ISRAD would follow the usual University bidding procedure in leasing the facilities, and Dr. Smith said that the buildings would be leased from some firm which supplies buildings on a year-to-year basis.

It was moved by Mr. Wolf, seconded by Dr. Wilkinson, that ISRAD be authorized to proceed with the program as outlined to the Regents. Carried.

* * * * *

Dedication of Land
for Construction of
Street from Eubank
to Lenkurt Site

Mr. Ortega brought to the Regents' attention a proposed deed for acreage the University had agreed earlier to dedicate for the construction of a street from Eubank to the corner of the Lenkurt site. He said that there was no monetary consideration except as part of the overall agreement with the City to make the site available at a certain price, which has already been done. Mr. Ortega said that the deed had been approved by both Mr. Perovich and Mr. Sloan and that the land area which was the subject matter of the deed was about three acres.

It was moved by Mr. Wolf, seconded by Mrs. Mapel, that the officers of the Regents be authorized to enter into the dedication deed to the City of Albuquerque for public highway purposes in the area of the Eubank property and that they be authorized to deliver that deed; also that the University Architect bring to the next meeting a plat, preferably on an aerial photograph, showing exactly what has been done. Carried.

<p>Dr. Wilkinson, commenting on the recent elections, said that he did not necessarily regard the results as a vote of confidence. "To me," he said, "it means that the people voted for candidates whom they felt had the best understanding of what the mission of the University is, what its objectives are, and had confidence in the way it is being operated at the present time. . . . I don't think it means that the Regents or the Administration have necessarily carried on a flawless program. . . but I think everyone has certainly tried. . . . I have the feeling that everyone now is trying to even redouble their efforts to make this a continuing educational institution of highest quality."</p>	<p>Remarks by Dr. Wilkinson</p>

Dr. Wilkinson noted that those who have made "perhaps judgmental remarks about the University should realize at this time that those remarks do indeed make it more difficult for the Administration and the Regents to carry on a first-class program." He continued, "I don't think everything that the Faculty has done has been flawless. I think in the field of peer evaluation of faculty members that there is room for improvement. I think it can safely be stated that the concept of academic freedom, which is most essential for any university, does not give license or responsibility for the faculty to feel a need to educate, provoke, or bait the public, and I think in a few limited instances perhaps this has been done. I would hope that peer evaluation could be sharpened a little in hopes of making our institution better in terms of goals we're shooting for."

Dr. Wilkinson concluded by an expression of confidence in the president and the vice presidents.


