Cal Poly is Home to the Largest Red Gum Tree Outside of Australia

Campus is now home to the largest known red gum eucalyptus (eucalyptus camaldulensis) outside of Australia. Matt Ritter, a professor in the Biological Sciences Department and California coordinator of the American Forest's National Register of Big Trees. recently listed the tree as the national champion on the California Big Tree Registry. The tree was measured by Ritter and students in the College of Science & Mathematics and the College of Agriculture, Food & Environmental Sciences after a

larger red gum in Fresno died. The Cal Poly red gum was planted in 1911 and can be seen in some of the earliest photos of campus. Janice Stone, a talented ceramist, Central Coast native and valued member of the Kennedy Library staff, will retire at the end of March. A reception to honor her service will be held from 2 to 4 p.m. Friday, March 28, on the second floor of the library near Julian's Café. A recipient of the Library Staff Award in 1993, Stone has worked at Kennedy Library since 1970, first as a student assistant, then as a staff member in the Reference Department, and eventually rising to supervise the Inter-Library Services unit. As the coordinator for Inter-Library Services since 1992, she has overseen more than 250,000 borrowing and lending requests that have contributed to student and researcher success. From the era of snail-mail content delivery to the almost instantaneous electronic delivery of information resources today, Stone has played a key role in the evolution of inter-library resource sharing.

#### In Memoriam

Steven J. Agronsky died Jan. 22. He was regarded as one of the finest professors in the Mathematics Department, a person who loved teaching as much as he loved mathematics. Whether teaching freshman calculus or graduate-level analysis, he explained the power of mathematics with clarity and verve. He was also the author of several research papers on analysis and dynamical systems. Agronsky completed his bachelor's, master's and doctorate degrees at UC Santa Barbara. He taught briefly at Cal Poly in the late 1970s and then joined the Mathematics



Department full-time in 1981. He retired from Cal Poly in 2012 but continued to teach intermittently until his passing. He had many interests aside from mathematics. #### Professional Training on Composting to be Held March 24-28

The Center for Sustainability in the College of Agriculture, Food & Environmental Sciences will hold a five-day professional training program on composting March 24-28 at the Cal Poly Compost Unit. The training will be comprised of two segments: a four-day certificate training program on largescale composting followed by a one-day workshop. The four-day workshop is designed to teach participants about the entire composting process, including site selection, management techniques, compost utilization, marketing strategies and the regulatory environment. Participants will also tour regional composting operations, farms and municipalities that have incorporated composting. A certificate of technical ability will be conferred upon completion of the course. The one-day workshop on March 28 will provide information for the effective assessment and use of compost for growers at all scales of production, building on information given at the four-day training. The four-day course is \$450, which includes instructional materials, lunch and breaks. The one-day workshop is \$150, though faculty, staff and students will be admitted free of charge. 
# MBA Students to Present Strategic Plans for Campus to Capitalize on Cal Poly's Intellectual Property on March 14
