I may be back in a year or two however, to report to you on the progress which we have made in establishing the Whitney Laboratory

of Seismology at Kilauea. The President of Technology and the Executive Committee have been most kind, and the people in the Hawaiian Islands have done everything for our project, so that I now feel that we have both strengthened the geological department at home and extended its influence abroad.
