They tell me I am practically out of danger of complications now. I wish that I could take the operation over again as a substitute for you, as that jou, too, might be, "complete m one volume." That is the way in which a cousin of mine describes it, who has likewise been relieved of her appendix. I am grieved that you should have had I take with you into the deautiful scenery of Shelbfurne so hateful a companion as appendicitis. But I hope that it may not make itself very troublesome. another cousin of mine has had it for fourteen years and has not yet been able Domake up her mind to an operation. Mine was a sudden and sharp attack, and an

immediate operation was imperative. miss Caroline Reilly has gone off on an excursion which will take her away until the beginning of august. Then she expects to be with me again and we shall try to cook up the syndicate article about mrs. Dargan. miss Redly tells me that the one for the Pictorial Review is to be written by a member of to staff who has been getting up a series of illustrated articles about prominent women. I think she said the name was miss Helen Bennett, miss Reilly seup she has after heard from her Southern friends about mrs. Dayson with great praise. Shey think she is eplendid miss Reilly varys she lately saw a short but pleasant account of mrs. Dangan m'some literary magazine,

but plue cannot for the life of her remember which. It is a week today since my operation. I viave all sorts of sinful indulgences, especially pickled fat salt pork, but hitherto I am kepptto a diet of naw white of egg alternating with a preparation of sour milk which Dr. Quith commends very highly as good for the plomach and bowels. They are using it a good deal at the hospital, you might suggest it to your doctor. you have lovely milk at Shelbfurne and as this preparation is easy to make, I your doctor approves of it, you could have it as often as you chose and it might relieve you.
