Background

- The Alberta OER members (albertaoer.com) wanted to sustain momentum generated by AB Gov. one-time funding
- Autumn 2018 sub-group of ABOER Community of Practice met via phone



• Started the journal club with no budget, limited time, & limited resources

The journal club format

- Long history in academia (Banderob, 2018)
- Doctors met & discussed published research (Deenadayalan et al, 2008)
- MRU library journal club (2018-19)
- Promotes deep thought and consideration



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Twitter chat journal club?

- Marry a Twitter discussion with a journal club
- Common format among k-12 educators (Tour, 2017)
- One facilitator per month
- Consistent day and time (weekly, monthly, etc.)
- Facilitator tweets questions for participants to answer
- Use #aboerjc and other hashtags (#oer #oep #opened)

Proposed Definition

The following definition of Open Education is proposed as primarily about social justice, while still allowing space for secondary benefits by other learners:

Open Education is the development of free digitally enabled learning materials and experiences primarily by and for the benefit and empowerment of non-privileged learners who may be under-represented in education systems or marginalised in their global context. Success of social justice aligned programs can be measured not by any particular technical feature or format, but intead by the extent to which they enact redistributive justice, and/or representational justice.

The inclusion of the phrase "by and for_ non-privileged learners" maintains the original intention of the 2002 OER definition regarding active participation by developing countries and the marginalised — rather than neo-colonial practices of the Global North doing things to and for those they consider disadvantaged.

With such a definition in place, other related definitions such as OER may remain unchanged to denote different foci within the field. For example, the definition of OEP could remain more broadly about the processes of collaboration and sharing in a wide range of educational practices to improve pedagogy for all learners. The term "critical open pedagogy" could continue to be used to identify the set of intentionally empowering OEP which seek to shift the power balance between learner and teacher as a particular strategy to reduce inequality (DeRobas & Robinson, 2017).
