## Preface

In 1978, David and Jeannette Green, collectors and book lovers, first approached the University about the donation of their complete set of Limited Editions Club publications.

Several months later, some 2,000 pounds of books, representing over 800 volumes, arrived and the systematic cataloging of this impressive and elegant collection began.

Mr. and Mrs. Green continued their interest in good literature, art, and fine books which had been developed, independently, during their undergraduate days—David Green at Lehigh University, class of '22 and Jeannette Green at Cornell University. This avocation further flourished in their law school days at Rutgers where they met and both graduated, class of '26. Indeed the bookplate specially designed by the Greens for the donation to Lehigh bears the representation of the scales of justice. They became one of the early subscribers to the Limited Editions Club, and continued through the years to the present.

These bibliophiles wanted to share with others their unique collection. With a keen interest in Lehigh University they also noted that this rich resource would enhance the educational program of our institution. The Lehigh Libraries are most grateful to Mr. and Mrs. Green for this fine gift. We know that it will provide stimulation and enjoyment to generations of students and to the Lehigh community for many years to come.

### Introduction

Aristophanes' *Lysistrata*, illustrated by Pablo Picasso; James Joyce's *Ulysses*, illustrated by Henri Matisse; Rachel Carson's *The Sea Around Us*, illustrated by Alfred Eisenstadt. These, and more than five hundred other titles, published over the past five decades, form the distinguished collection of the Limited Editions Club. It has been called the 'Rolls Royce of book clubs.' And, indeed, it is just that.

A century ago, the board of trustees charged the first director of the Lehigh University Library to acquire "items illustrative of the art of book-production." In that context, it is especially fitting that Lehigh should, sooner or later, have the Limited Editions Club collection. *Item:* the paper on which these books are printed is specially made (acid-free, and thus permanent). *Item:* the bindings are handstitched (not glued). *Item:* the historic type is carefully selected, and hand-set. Art - self-conscious art - pervaded the production of these books. Thus the trustees' mandate.

Founded in 1929 by George Macy, the Limited Editions Club has, over the years, given the world a wide variety of the classics, designed and illustrated by modern masters. Today, under the leadership of Sidney Schiff, the Club continues to insist upon the highest standard.

By the present catalog, Lehigh University expresses its thanks to Jeannette and David Green for the gift of their Limited Editions Club collection.

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

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
