Foreword

The doors of the Lehigh University Library first opened in 1878. Munificently endowed, it soon became known among booksellers both here and abroad as "the American library with a lot of money for books". But more than money was required to form what the *Encyclopaedia Britannica* as early as 1910 described as an "important" American academic library. In his mandate from the board of trustees, Dr. William H. Chandler, first director of the library, was charged to acquire *inter alia* items illustrative of the art of book production. Moving with great skill and imagination, Dr. Chandler interpreted the charge broadly, and proceeded to build the foundation for the present distinguished Rare Book Collection. Thus: the four Shakespeare Folios, the double elephant folio of Audubon's *Birds of America*, Copernicus' *De Revolutionibus Orbium Coelestium* (1543), thirteen early editions of Ptolemy, a fine group of travels and voyages, several rare Bibles and a number of medieval manuscripts.

In due course three collections of books came to the university by gift, one from Eckley B. Coxe, in mining and metallurgy, which included Georg Agricola's *De Re Metallica* (1556); another from the late Harvey Bassler, B.S., '08, Sc.D., '45, in the natural sciences. It was under this bequest that the university received the *Voyage de Humboldt et Bonpland*, D'Orbigny's *Voyage dans L'Amérique Meridionale*, and the three voyages of Captain James Cook.

In 1929 Robert Brodhead Honeyman, Met. E. '20, L.H.D., '59, made his first gift of books to his university. Here were, for example, the first edition of Euclid's *Elementa* (1482) together with the first English edition (1570) and a leaf of the manuscript of Darwin's *On the Origin of Species*. Then in 1955, Mr. and Mrs. Honeyman gave their superb collection of English and American literature — at a time when the only prominent American author represented in the vault was Melville (by the first American edition of *Moby Dick*). This gift of some 4,000 volumes contains unusual strength in a number of authors: Edmund Spenser and John Milton among the English; Cooper, Irving, Melville and Whitman among the American. In addition, the gift included a number of landmarks in political thought and in science as well. Four years later, on the occasion of the Darwin centenary, the Honeymans presented their great Darwin collection, including the unique Proof Copy of the *Origin* and each of the first seven editions.

It has been said that, for its size — 7,000 volumes — this Rare Book Collection is the best in America. It is hoped that it will continue to grow, perhaps at a more steady rate than it has in the past.

What follows is a short-title list of two-hundred representative works

in various fields, some purchased by the university, others given, and all forming a significant national resource. This is where this collection stands as it reaches its one-hundredth year.

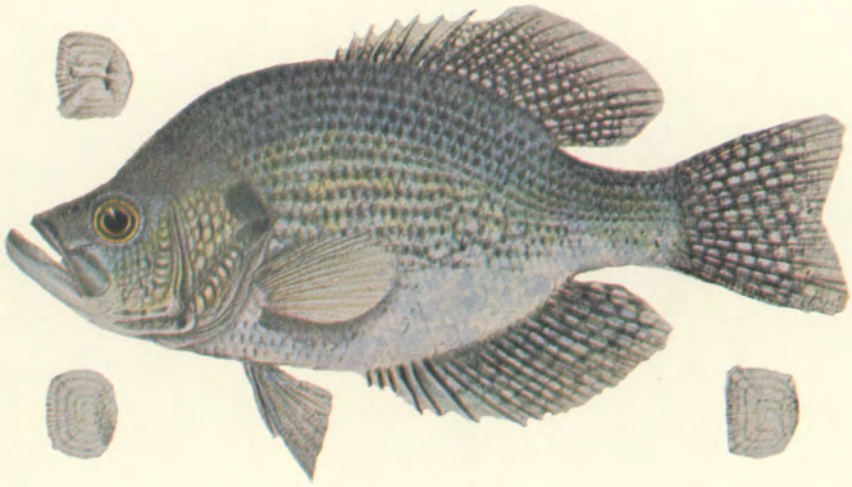
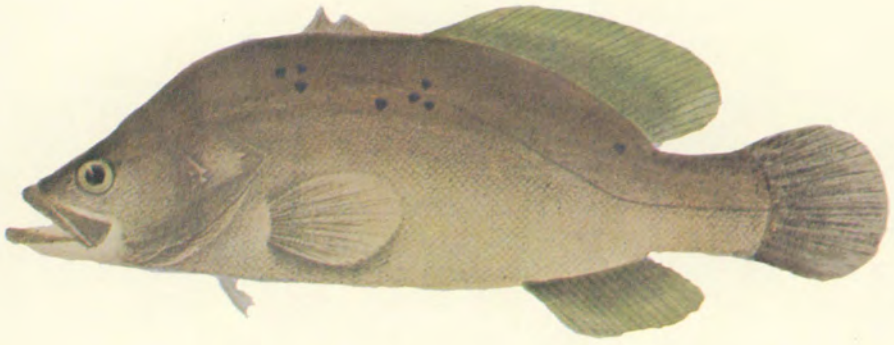
