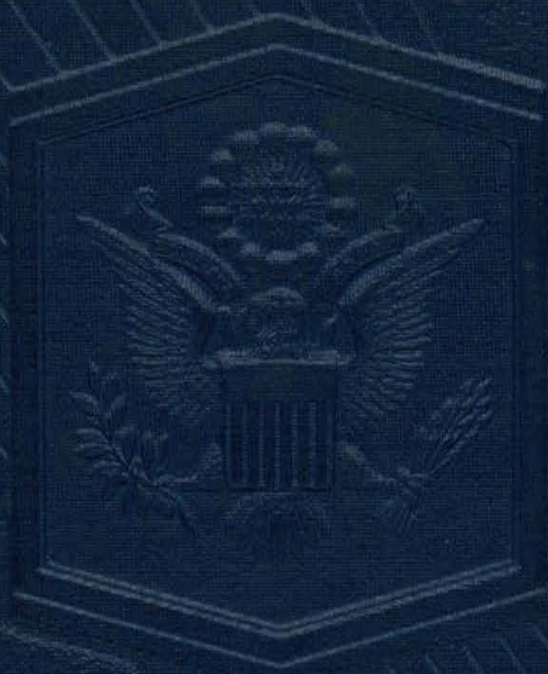

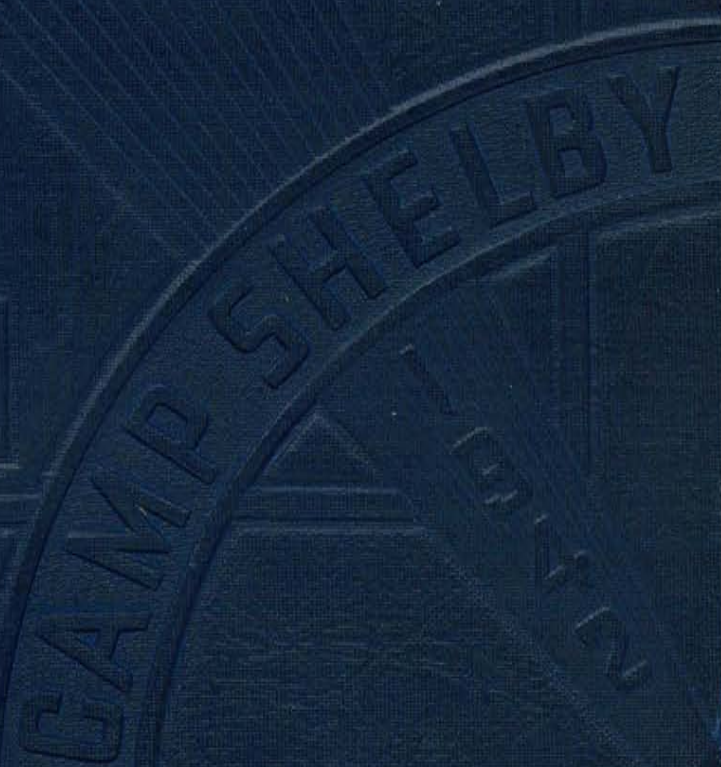

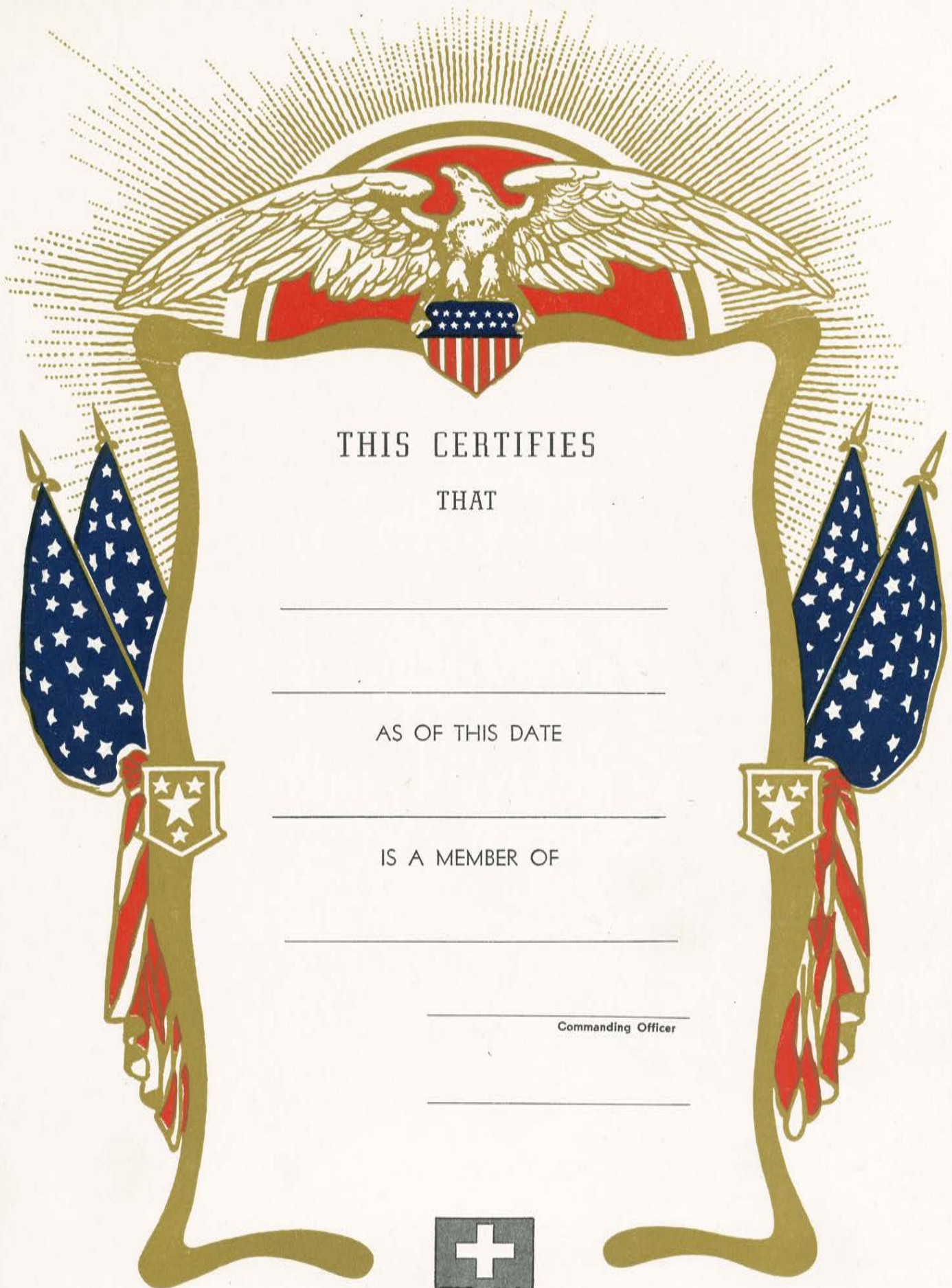

JOHN H. HESTER

Born in Albany, Georgia, September 11, 1886. Attended the University of Georgia, where he was a member of Alpha Tau Omega fraternity. Commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in 1908 after graduation from West Point. In 1921 graduated from the Infantry School and in 1922 was honor graduate of the School of the Line. In 1923 graduated from the General Staff School and in 1927 from the Army War College.

Further history of his career includes two years (1914 and 1915) in the Philippines and service in 1916 with Pershing's Punitive Expedition in Mexico. During the World War he was initially with the Sixth Division and later served on the War Department General Staff. In 1933-35, he served in Puerto Rico. Was com-

manding officer of the First Infantry in 1939, executive for Reserve Affairs in the War Department in 1940-41 and was commissioned a permanent Brigadier General on November 1, 1940.

In April, 1941, was assigned to command Camp Wheeler, Georgia, Infantry Replacement Training Center. On October 8, 1941, was assigned to command the 43rd Infantry Division at Camp Blanding, Florida, and later led the division through a month of successful maneuvers in the Carolinas. Was commissioned Major General on February 14, 1942, on the 34th anniversary of his graduation from the United States Military Academy at West Point. Directed the Division's conversion into a "streamlined" triangular Division in February, 1942.

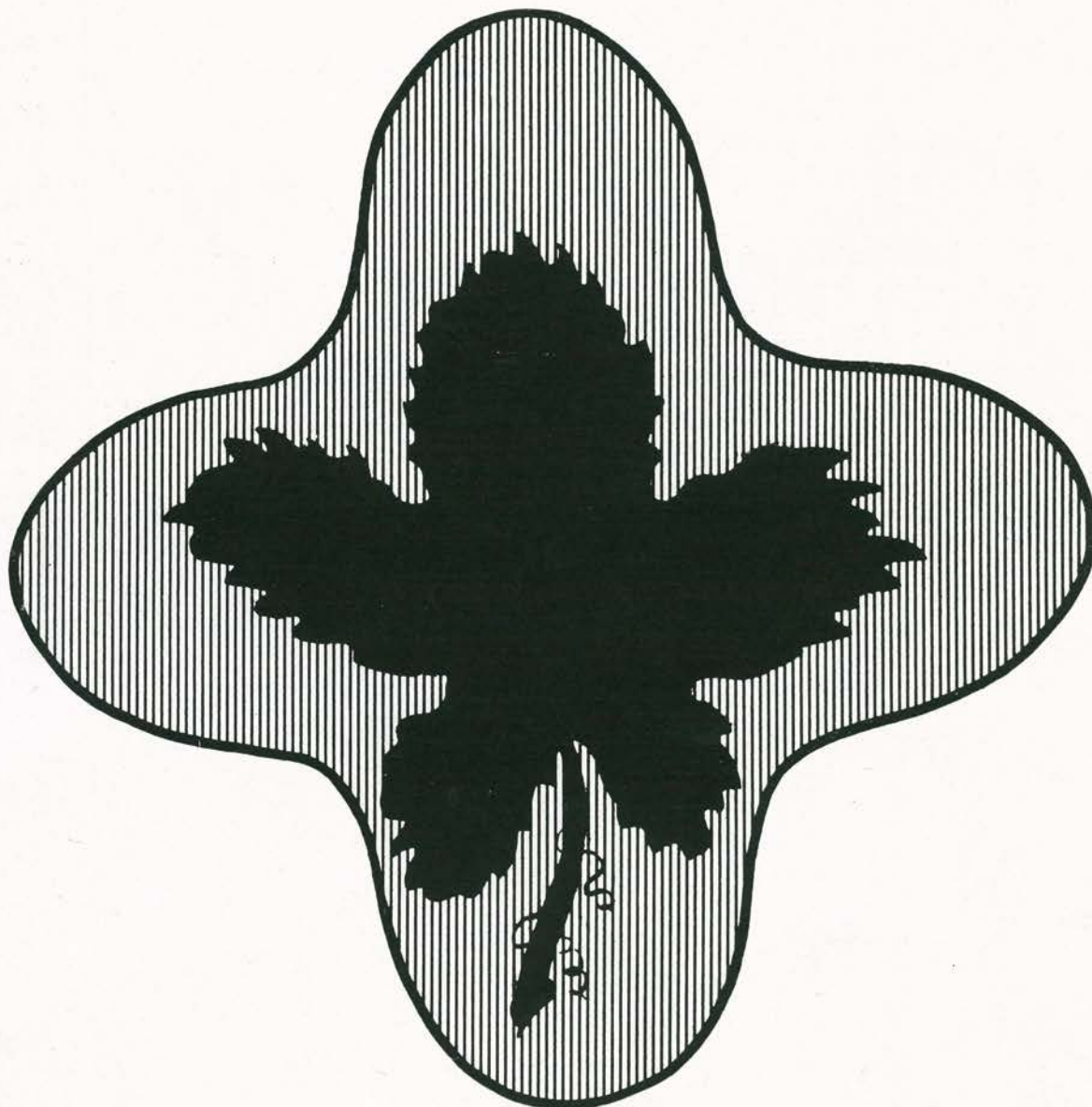

Insignia

43RD INFANTRY DIVISION



BLAZONRY

On a red quatre foil, a black grapeleaf.

DESCRIPTION

The official insignia of the 43rd Infantry Division, largely composed of New England men, is a black Grapeleaf on a red quatre foil.

The Grapeleaf is representative of the fact that the four New England States from which the units of the Division come—Vermont, Maine, Connecticut, and Rhode Island—were once called Vineland. When Leif Ericsson, the Scandinavian explorer, discovered what is now New

England, he remarked about the wild grapevines he found and called the region "Vinland," or "Vineland."

The red background of the insignia is used to indicate that New England was once a British possession.

The four globules of the red foil represent the four states—Maine, Vermont, Connecticut, and Rhode Island.

Although the Division insignia itself is comparatively new, some of the regimental insignia in the Division rank with the country's oldest and most tradition-studded.

HISTORY OF THE 43RD INFANTRY DIVISION

With the decision, following the World War, to organize two National Guard Divisions in each of the nine Corps Areas the 43rd Division came into being.

Inasmuch as many of the units of the Division had formerly been a part of the famous wartime "Yankee" Division (26th), they were allowed to keep their World War designations, with the result that the Division has within its units that have histories covering every war in which the nation has participated.

The combined histories of the units of the 43rd reads like a roll of honor of history of America, and the battle streamers amassed by these units reveal the farflung engagements in which men of the New England States have been called upon to defend their country's interests.

The 43rd was allocated to the States of Maine, Ver-

mont, Rhode Island, and Connecticut, and in each of the four states units were organized and federally recognized. The three brigades of the Division were allocated so that the control could be centralized to the greatest extent. The 85th Brigade was allocated entirely to Connecticut, and consisted of the 102nd and 169th Infantry Regiments. The 86th Brigade was allocated to Maine and Vermont, and consisted of the 103rd Infantry (Maine) and the 172nd Infantry (Vermont). The 68th Field Artillery was allocated to Maine, Rhode Island, and Connecticut and consisted of the 103rd and 152nd Regiments (75-mm.) and the 192nd (155-mm. Howitzer).

The Division Headquarters was allocated to Connecticut and remained there. The Special Troops (Tank Company, M. P. Company, Division Headquarters Company

and Division Headquarters Detachment) were also allocated to Connecticut.

The Division Signal Company was allocated to Rhode Island, as was the 118th Engineer Regiment (Combat).

The 118th Medical Regiment was allocated to Vermont, Rhode Island, and Connecticut, with headquarters in Connecticut.

The 118th Quartermaster Regiment was allocated to Maine, Vermont, Rhode Island, and Connecticut, with headquarters in Connecticut.

The Ordnance Company was allocated to Rhode Island and the Division Aviation to Connecticut.

The command of the 85th Brigade was located permanently in New Haven, Connecticut, while the command of the 86th Brigade alternated between Maine and Vermont. The command of the 68th Brigade was located in Rhode Island from the time of the activation of the Division.

The action-filled months between February and December of 1941 found the 43rd Infantry Division undergoing the kind of all-out training, both in camp and on field maneuvers, that turns out well-trained soldiers and hardened fighting men.

When war flared up early last December, the New Englanders had 13 weeks of intensive preliminary training and three months of rugged maneuvers to their credit. They had also rolled up one of the outstanding travel records in the new Army.

The original National Guard units of the 43rd Division were formally inducted into active Federal service at 2:00 P.M., February 24, 1941, in Maine, Vermont, Rhode Island, and Connecticut. The induction ceremony was broadcast over a network of twelve New England stations. The oath of allegiance was readministered by Lieutenant General Hugh A. Drum, commander of the First Army. Remarks were made by Governor Robert A. Hurley of Connecticut, Major General James A. Woodruff, commanding First Corps Area, and Major General Morris B. Payne, of New London, Connecticut, Commanding General of the 43rd Division.

Advance elements of the Division reached the 43rd's base camp at Camp Blanding, Florida, on March 9, 1941, and the movement of the bulk of troops by rail and truck was completed by March 19.

Under the command of General Payne, the 43rd Division immediately entered upon 13 weeks of intensive training. The daily work at Blanding was given a competitive edge by the presence of the 31st (Dixie) Division, which shared Blanding with the 43rd, and which had entered Federal Service in the early fall of 1940.

The 13-week training course included thorough grounding in the fundamentals of soldiering. Military courtesy was stressed as were the strenuous drills that condition soldiers physically.

In mid-June, hundreds of men, who had been inducted into the Army under the Selective Service Act, began to arrive at Blanding, from Camp Wheeler, Georgia, Infantry Replacement Center, and Fort Bragg, North Carolina, Artillery Replacement Center, to join the 43rd Division. The newcomers had just finished 13 weeks of basic training. The men from Wheeler were trained by Major General John H. Hester, who later came to the 43rd Division as its Commanding General, succeeding General Payne.

In late June and early July, the majority of the 43rd's personnel received well-deserved leaves and furloughs which permitted them to visit their families in New England.

First wedding in the camp area took place May 10, 1941. Private Chester O. Gill, Battery F, 103rd Field Artillery, and Olive Nuthal, Riverside, R. I.

The advent of replacements in the 43rd Division gave the New England unit a cosmopolitan flavor it had not had hitherto, for now the command was composed of men from virtually every state in the Eastern section of the United States.

At the end of July, the Division convoyed 850 miles westward to Louisiana, where during August and September as part of the Third Army, it engaged in the greatest peace-time maneuvers this nation has ever staged. For two months the soldiers underwent hard-

ships and discomforts, were toughened and learned field discipline.

Back at Blanding, the 43rd settled down for more training and on October 8, 1941, General Hester assumed command of the Division.

General Hester, a West Pointer with a brilliant Army career, instituted a precise and well-regulated program of training military discipline. The General's leadership immediately gave the 43rd a new nickname. General Hester comes from Georgia, and the men of the 43rd were promptly called the "Yankee Crackers."

General Hester led the Division north to the Carolinas in late October where the 43rd, as part of the Fourth Army Corps, participated in the GHQ maneuvers of November. The Division was one of three divisions in the Army of the United States to take part in the two great maneuvers of 1941.

In the Carolinas, all the latest weapons and methods of war were tested. The 43rd, General Hester told his men at the conclusion of the maneuvers, carried through everyone of its missions successfully.

The 43rd Division convoyed back to Blanding, early in December, to resume training. The Division was hard at work and prepared for any eventuality when the Japanese struck at Pearl Harbor.

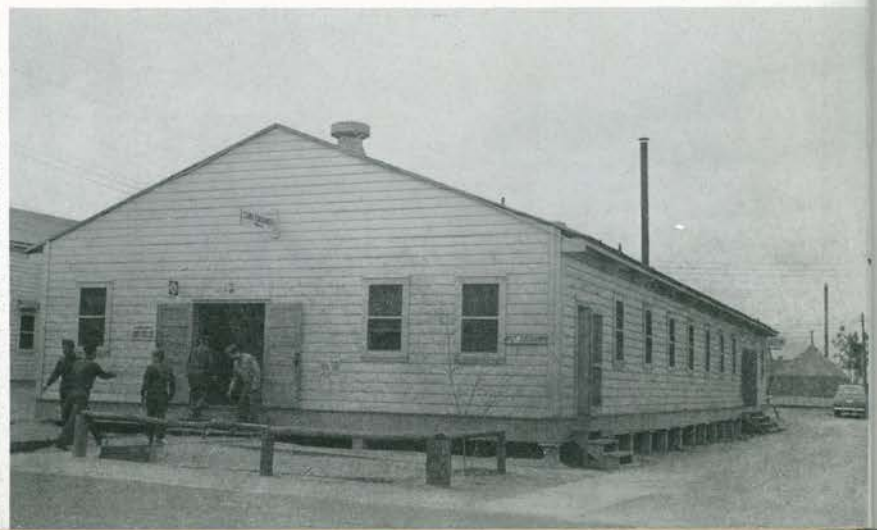
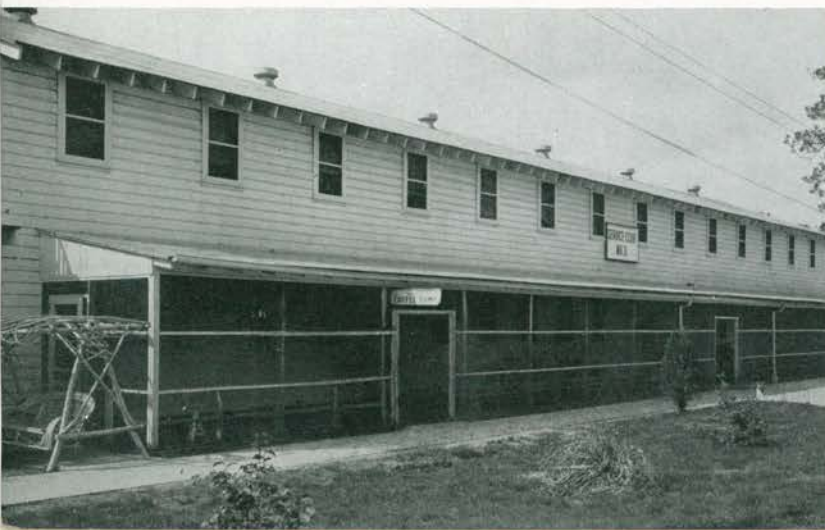

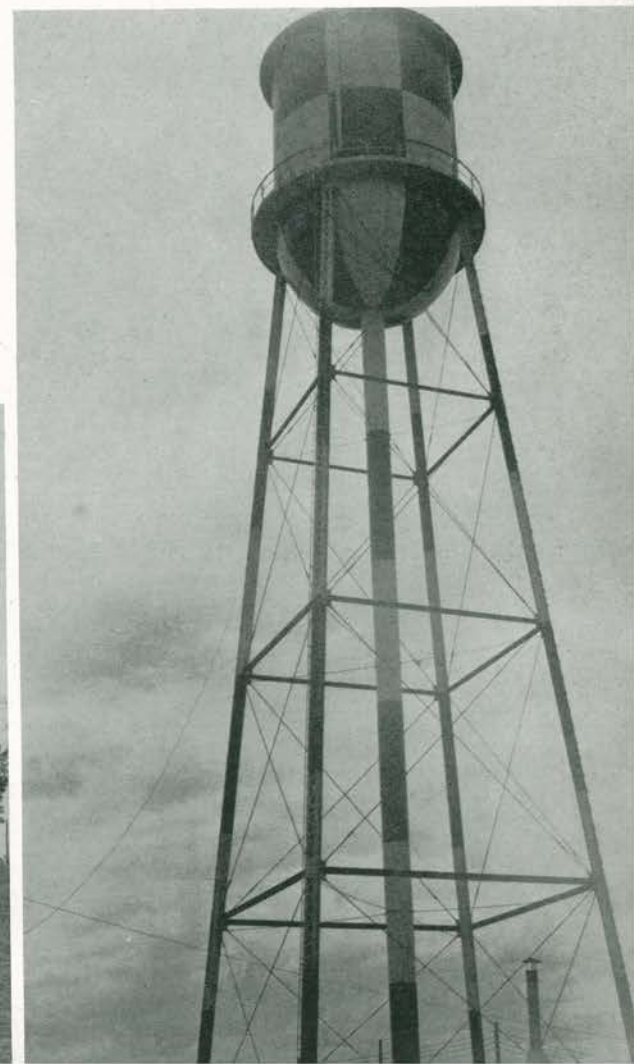

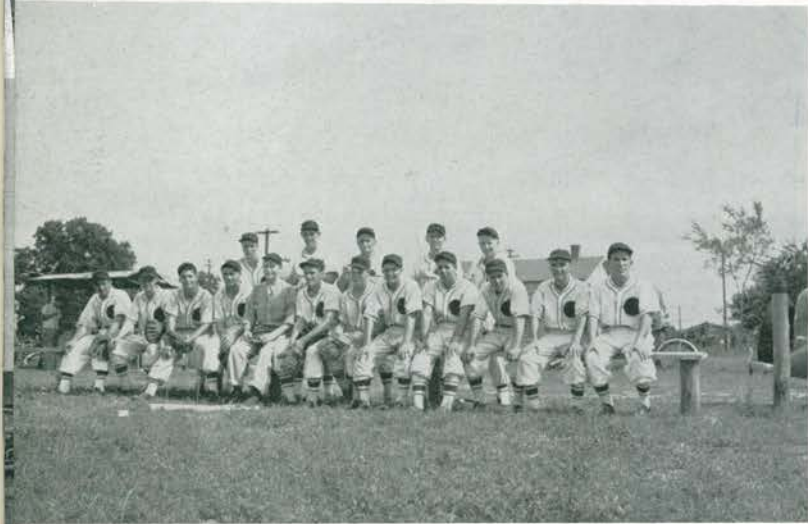

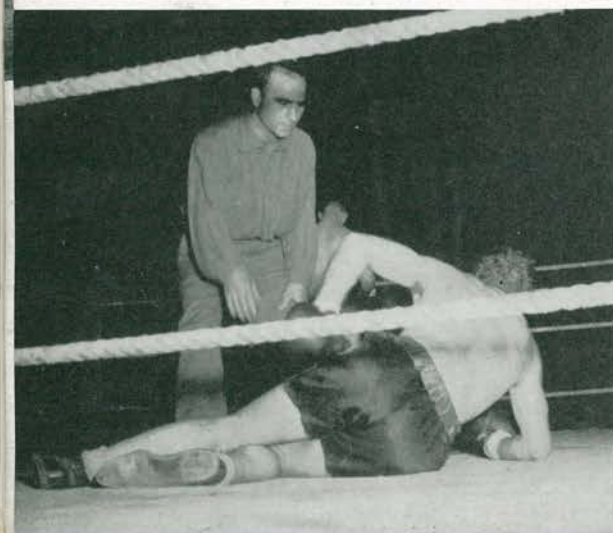

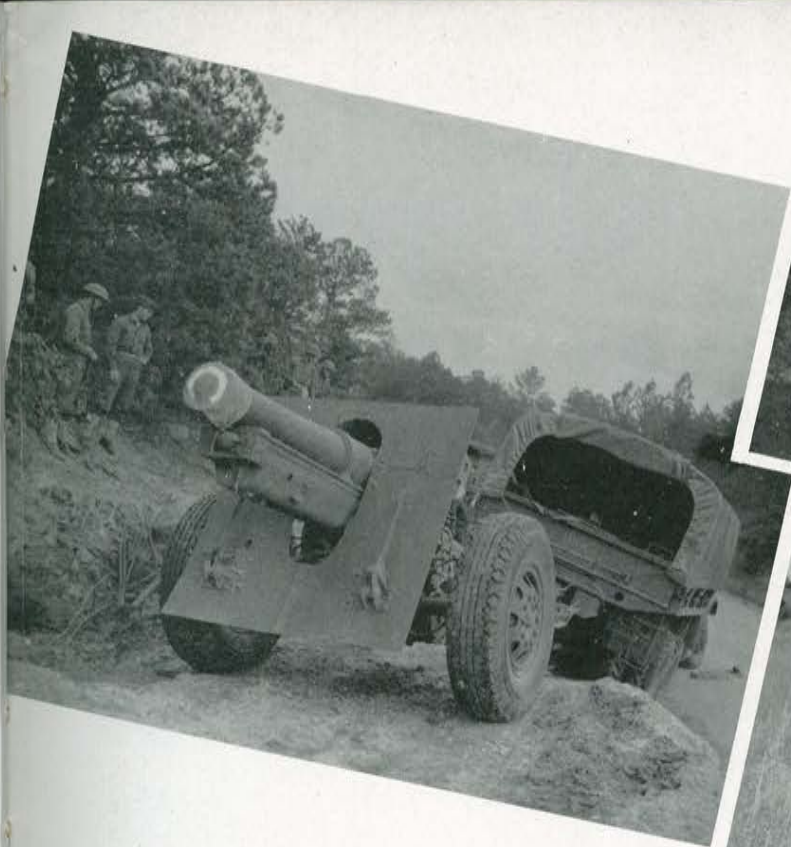

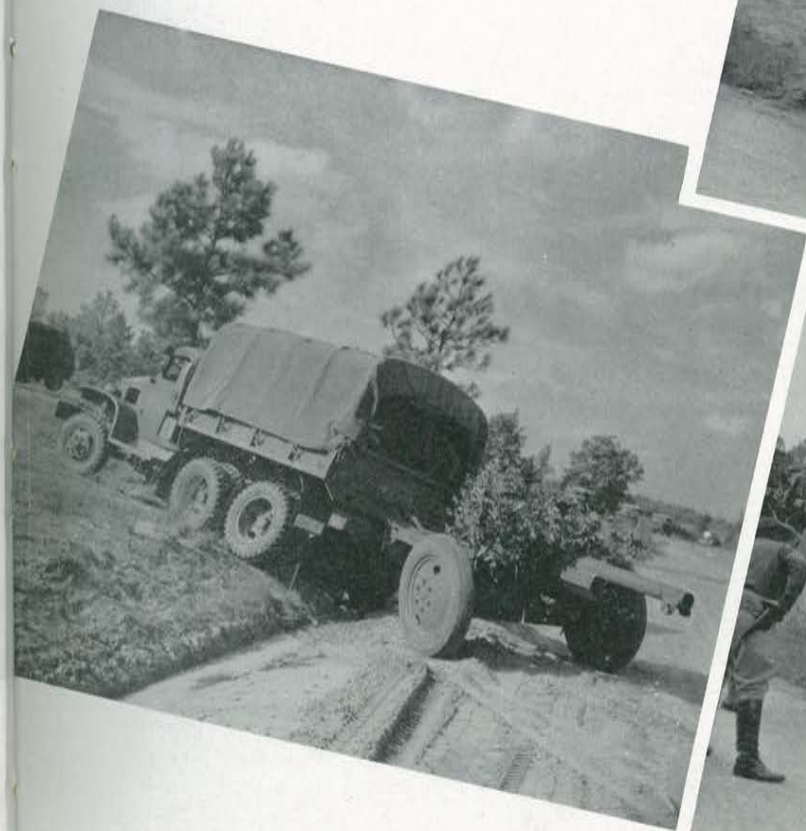


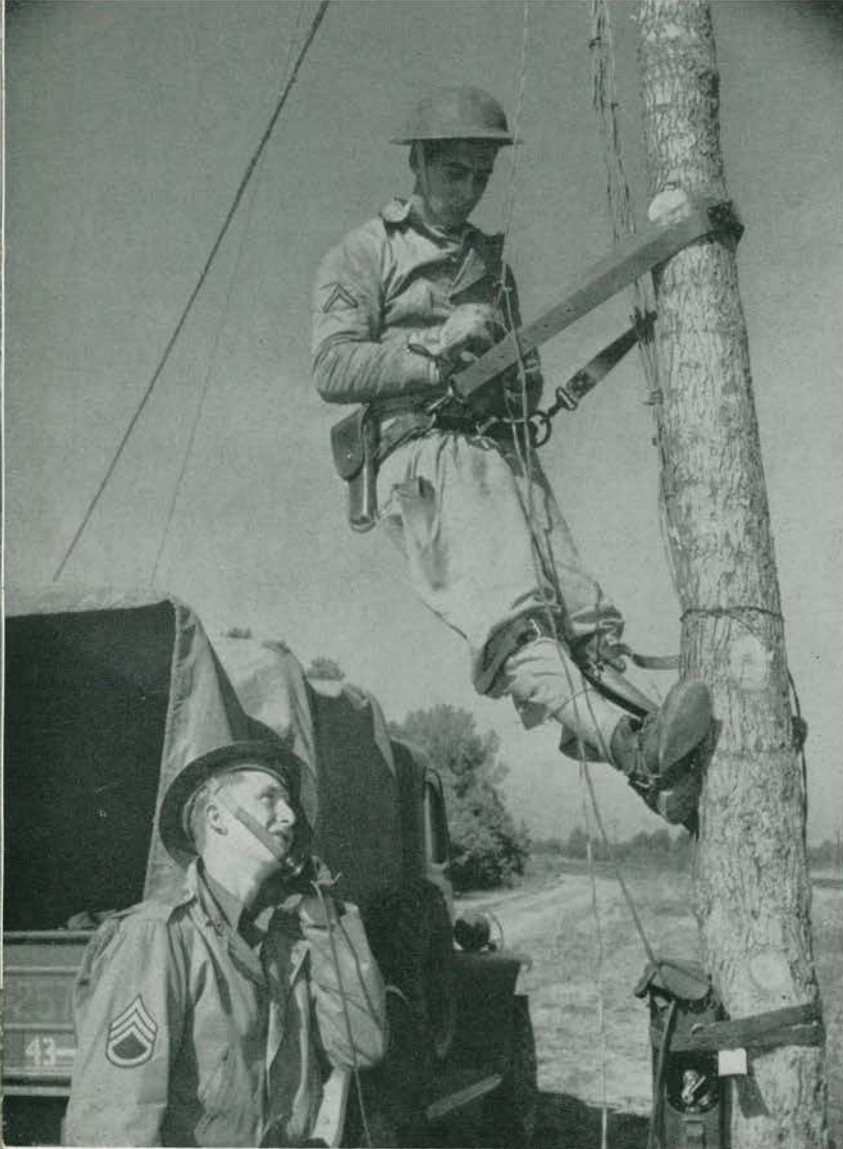

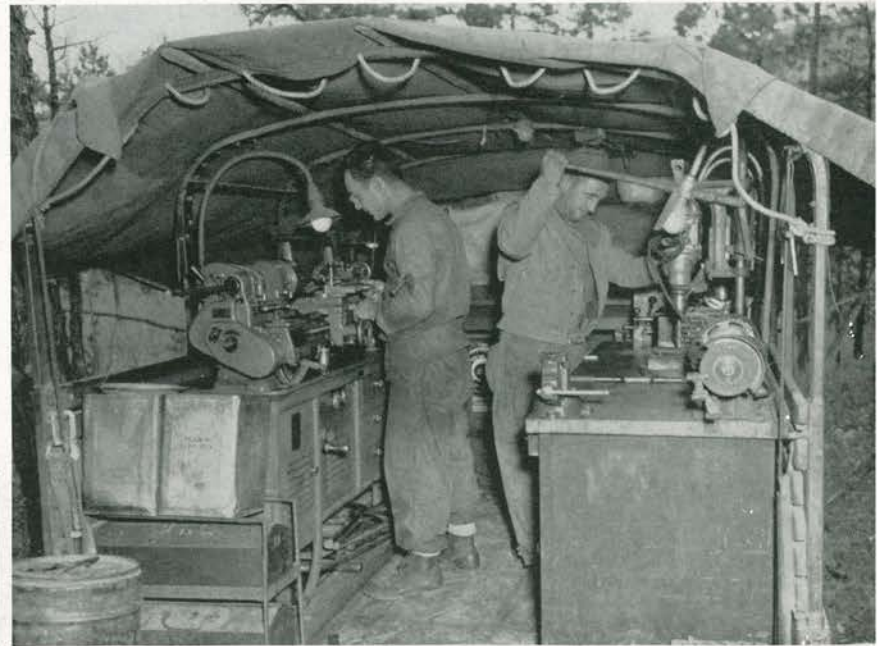

TO OFFICERS AND MEN OF THE 172ND INFANTRY

ITS TRADITIONS AND HISTORY GIVES THE 172ND INFANTRY FAITH IN THE FUTURE

One of the country's largest National Guard regiments, the 172nd Infantry, mobilized under command of Colonel Reginald W. Buzzell at a strength of 123 officers and 1,772 enlisted men on February 24, 1941, and three weeks later was transplanted from a snow-blanketed Vermont winter to the burning sun of sandy Camp Blanding, Florida, there to start the intensive training job to fit it for whatever the future might bring. It was twofold transformation: from civilian to military pursuits, from winter to summer overnight; and constituted a fitting prelude to another chapter in the history of a regiment which traces its traditions back to Ethan Allen and his Green Mountain Boys. Across the top of the shield which these Vermonters prize as their regimental emblem, above the outline of Green Mountains and blue lakes, a scroll carries the motto: "Put the Vermonters Ahead." It is no chamber of commerce slogan, but dates back to Civil War days when General Sedgwick in his famous order to the Sixth Corps on July 1, 1863, before it started its gruelling 32-mile march from Manchester to Gettysburg said: "Put the Vermonters ahead and keep the column closed up."

The Vermont Regiment traces its beginning to the old First Infantry which was mobilized under the call of President Lincoln on April 15, 1861, the nucleus of which was existing companies of the uniformed militia. It entered the Federal Service on May 9, 1861, being redesignated the First Vermont Volunteers. Then there was no time for an MTP or 13-weeks intensive training program and five companies of Vermonters took part in the battle at Great Bethel, Virginia, on June 10, just a month after their entry into the Federal Service. Then, too, they were not signed up for the "duration," for on August 15 of the same year the First Vermont Volunteers were mustered out of Federal Service and reverted to their former state status.

The next year, the 12th Infantry was organized, absorbing seven of the 12 companies of the First Vermont Volunteers, they served in Virginia and Pennsylvania. They were mustered out once more on July 14, 1863, and reorganized in three regiments, each of which included units from the First and 12th Vermont Volunteers. This organization saw them through the war between the states.

Almost a decade later, and seven years after the Civil War was over, the Vermont General Assembly in an act approved November 27, 1872, consolidated and redesignated the remnants of three veteran regiments to form the First Infantry.

If Vermonters regarded with some misgivings the War Department's decision at the outset of the present emergency to train New England troops in the South, they were based on tragic memories of the veterans of the War with Spain, who experienced the privations and horror of the crowded and disease-ridden Chickamauga, Georgia, camp during the summer of 1898. As the First Vermont Volunteers, the Green Mountain regiment entered the Federal Service on May 19 of that year and was mustered out on November 7, returning to state status.

Veteran officers still with the 172nd Infantry, including Colonel Buzzell, its Commanding Officer, recall the Vermonters' next call into Federal Service and the summer spent at Eagle Pass, Texas, during the Mexican Border crisis. That time the First Vermont was mobilized on

June 19, 1916, and mustered out four months later, on October 11.

The Vermont regiment virtually lost its identity in the World War. Mobilized on April 2, 1917, and assembled at the state military reservation at Fort Ethan Allen, Vermont, the First Vermont soon was broken up and 19 officers and 1,388 enlisted men transferred to various units of the 26th (Yankee) Division. What remained was redesignated the 57th Pioneer Infantry on February 9, 1918, and the personnel used as replacements in France, except for a cadre maintained to preserve the organization's identity. They were mustered out of Federal Service on March 4, 1918.

The Regiment was reorganized as the First Vermont Infantry in 1919 and redesignated the 172nd Infantry on October 1, 1921.

Until the present emergency, the 172nd Infantry had only been called out four times in nearly 20 years, twice on strike duty, and twice for rehabilitation work during the disastrous Vermont floods of November, 1927, and May, 1936. The first strike duty was during a paper mill labor dispute at Bellows Falls, Vermont, in 1921, the last during the granite workers' strike in Barre, Vermont, in the spring of 1933, when about half the regiment was on duty for three weeks.

During its first year in the Federal Service, the 172nd Infantry, its Vermont identity gradually being tempered by trainees from a dozen northern and southern states, twice left Camp Blanding, Florida, to take part in large scale maneuvers: first, in Louisiana during August and September, 1941; and in South Carolina, during November. It bounced with the 43rd Division from Third Army to First Army control, and back again when it was ordered to change station to Camp Shelby, Mississippi, early in February.

Application of the overage-in-grade policy by the War Department cost the Regiment 30 officers shortly after return from the Carolina maneuvers. Among them were all but a handful of the 17 officer veterans of 1917-18 who had come into the Service with the Vermont Regiment to prepare for what turned out to be World War No. II.

The regiment celebrated the first anniversary of its induction into the Federal Service at Camp Shelby while the 43rd was in the throes of triangularization, its enlisted strength up to nearly 2,300, but its officer personnel depleted to 86 from the 123 originally inducted.

Streamers authorized: Civil War, Virginia, 1861; Virginia, 1862; Gettysburg; World War, without inscription.

Coat of Arms: Approved May 2, 1923; amended January 12, 1923.

Shield: Per fess debased sky blue and lake blue, a fess debased green consisting of "Mt. Mansfield" and "The Camels Hump" all proper; in chief a cross couped argent.

Motto: Put the Vermonters Ahead.

Description: The shield shows Mount Mansfield and the Camel's Hump, as seen from the west across Lake Champlain, the characteristic portion of the Green Mountains and recalls not only the popular name of the State but also the record of the "Green Mountain Boys" in all the wars of the country and particularly in the Revolution. The silver cross was the badge of the old "Vermont Brigade," Second Division, Sixth Corps, one of the most famous brigades of the Civil War and in which over one-third of all the men from Vermont served.

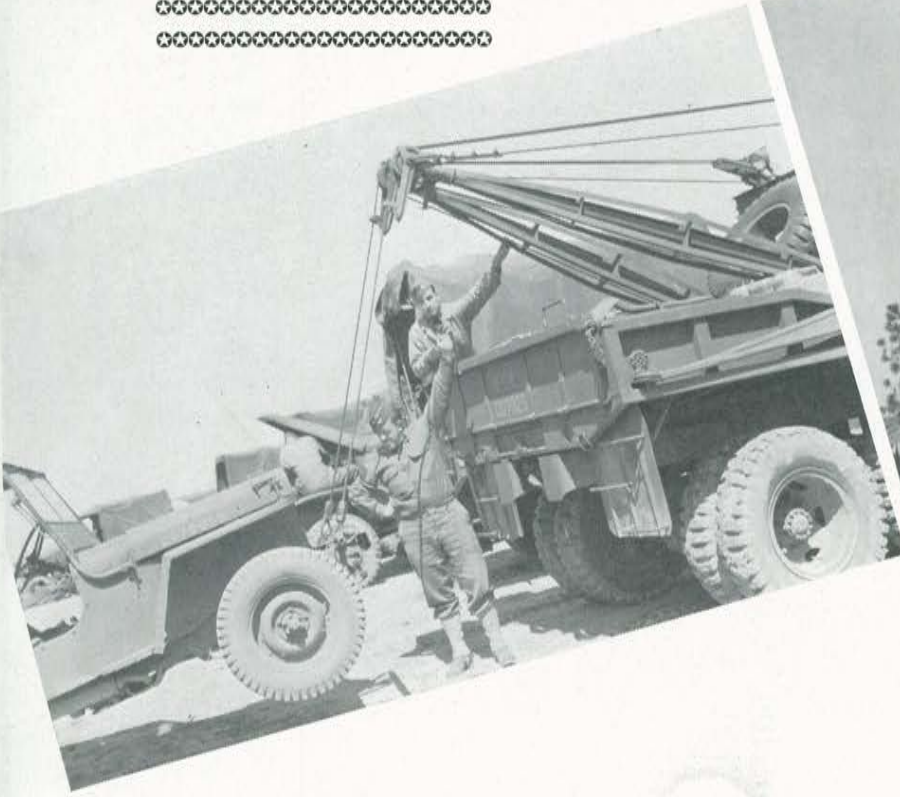
