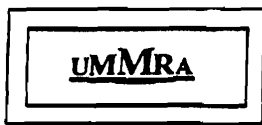

SAD NEWS

Former publisher of the *Morris Sun Tribune* and *Hancock Record* Edward J. Morrison, 96, died Wednesday, Jan. 4 at his home in Scottsdale, Ariz.



Ed and Helen Jane owned the *Sun and Tribune* and *Hancock Record* for many years before the newspaper was sold in 1999 to the Forum Communications Company of Fargo, N.D. The *Morris Tribune* had been owned by the Morrison family since 1898. The family had owned the *Morris Sun* since 1947.

Morrison was a founder and former president of the West Central Educational Development Association, an organization which provided vital support to the Morris Campus in its earliest years. Wife Helen Jane joined him in his efforts to secure the campus, and additionally served as organizer of Morris's very first concert series, leading eventually to the founding of today's performing arts series. They contributed generously to scholarships over a long period, in addition to their gifts for the renovation and endowment of the art gallery that bears their name.

KUDOS

Elijah Mayfield '09 is listed among *Forbes* magazine's 30 Under 30 (Education 2017). At 27, Elijah is vice president of New Technologies for Turnitin. Out to improve student writing skills using machine learning, language processing and intelligent tutoring algorithms. Mayfield sold LightSide Labs, which he cofounded with grants from the Gates Foundation, McGraw Hill and the College Board, to plagiarism-prevention giant Turnitin in 2014. LightSide is helping 250,000 students in about 500 middle and high schools in over 30 states. Mayfield left a Carnegie-Mellon Ph.D. program to found LightSide in 2013. He was awarded a 2013 IBM Ph.D. Fellowship, and is an author/co-author on more than 25 peer-reviewed publications on language technologies and human-computer interaction. He holds a master of arts from Carnegie Mellon University and a bachelor of arts in science from UMM.

Morris has been named to *Kiplinger's Personal Finance's* list of the Top 300 Best College Values of 2017. This is the ninth consecutive year in which the campus has been included on the public colleges list, which acknowledges academic quality and affordability.

Michelle Behr named new chancellor *Melissa Vangness, University Relations*



Michelle Behr, Ph.D., has been named the sixth chancellor of the University of Minnesota, Morris effective February 6, 2017.

“I am thrilled that we are able to attract a leader of Michelle’s caliber,” said University of Minnesota President Eric Kaler. “Michelle’s broad experience in the liberal arts, deep commitment to students and engagement in the broader higher education community make her an ideal person to lead the Morris campus.”

Dr. Behr is currently the provost, senior vice president for Academic Affairs, and dean of the College at Birmingham-Southern College (BSC) in Birmingham, Ala. Prior to her arrival at BSC, she served in various roles—as a faculty member, department chair, university assessment coordinator, and college dean at several public institutions of higher education.

“It is a great privilege to have been selected as Morris’ next chancellor. I am committed to its mission as a public liberal arts college and as I immerse myself in the campus and its culture, I expect my passion for the university will only deepen. I am excited to collaborate with the university community and friends to further the great work already taking place at Morris and

together ensure a vibrant future for UMM,” said Behr.

Dr. Behr earned her baccalaureate degree in anthropology with honors from the University of California, Santa Cruz, and her master’s and doctoral degrees from Arizona State University in anthropology and geography, respectively. She is a three-time Fulbright Scholar and was selected an American Council on Education Fellow in 2005-2006.

Dr. Behr succeeds Jacqueline R. Johnson, who retires after more than 10 years at Morris.

Town Hall Water Summit
