RCC Board Race Stirs 'Hushed' History Of No Blacks

District Representation Questioned



The economy is a bust, state coffers are empty, voters are mad, Barack Obama is riding an anti-incumbent mood to the White House and five challengers for two open seats on the coveted Riverside Community College District board sense hope in the nation's appetite for change.

The stakes are especially high for Linnie Frank Bailey, Delorise Anderson and Samuel Davis who like Obama are attempting to shatter history. If elected in November the winner(s) would become the first African-American(s) elected to the 92-year-old institution's Board of Trustees.

Bailey, Anderson and Davis (who ran unsuccessfully for the RCC board in 2006) know they're in an uphill race laced with a huge swath of variables that might have an

impact on people's votes – including race, ideology and party identification. Many in the Riverside County African American community describe the local political scene as a near impenetrable network of big money politics emboldened by a herd mentality of colonial racial views and a 'hushed' history of exclusion at the ballot box and beyond.

"My candidacy is about getting rid of the stalemate," argues Bailey the 52-year-old Obama delegate from California's 44th District, a Corona mom and self-described 'blogger on training wheels'. Most election watchers feel Bailey poses the biggest challenge to incumbents, board President Mary Figueroa elected in 1995 and Mark Takano a board member since 1990.


In June the Washington Post chronicled this political neophyte's ascent from a \$10

ARMC Medical Director Installed As President

Dr. Dev GnanaDev, Arrowhead Regional Medical Center medical director and advocate of quality health care for those who are less fortunate, was installed as president of the California Medical Association (CMA) Sunday in Sacramento.

Dr. GnanaDev, chief of surgery and medical director at ARMC since 2000, becomes only the third physician from San Bernardino or Riverside counties to serve as president in the CMA's 152-year history.

The CMA, formed in 1856, is an advocacy organization that represents more than 34,000 California physicians. Dedicated to the health of Californians, CMA is active in the legal, legislative, reimbursement and regulatory areas on behalf of physicians and their patients.

"I'm honored to serve as President of the word," said Dr. GnanaDev, who has

Green Valley Initiative Receives \$100,000 Grant

SCE to help fund the economic development initiative to bring green-tech jobs and industry to the Inland Empire

The Green Valley Initiative (GVI) has been awarded a \$100,000 grant from Southern California Edison (SCE) to help further the progress being made to promote clean and green technologies in Riverside and San Bernardino counties.

GVI is a regional economic develop-

ment plan launched in 2007 to promote renewable energy sources, alternative fuels, biotech, nanotech and other sustainable industries in Riverside and San Bernardino counties, a Southern California region referred to as the Inland Empire. To date, the boards of supervisors of both counties, the Western Riverside Council of Governments and more than 25 city and public agencies have adopted resolutions in support of the initiative.

"Southern California Edison is excited to see the cities, counties, businesses, universities and community leaders of the Inland Empire working together to establish a better future for the region," said Les Starck, SCE Vice-President of Local Public Affairs. "The Inland Empire is ideally suited for these types of technologies

for a variety of reasons, most notably its anticipated population growth, proximity to major transportation hubs and its boundless sunshine. We look forward to being a part of this important transformation for Inland Southern California."

Starck will present the grant to GVI Chairman Ali Sahabi Thursday at the U.S. Department of Commerce's National District Export Council Conference at the Wyndham Hotel in Palm Springs. The conference, "Travel & Trade, Redefining Exports," has dedicated a portion of its programming to clean and green industries, particularly those highlighted through the Green Valley Initiative.

Sahabi said the grant will help fund the necessary steps toward establishing an independent, regional entity that will

assume operations of GVI in January.

"Southern California Edison is leading by example, showing the world that it makes good business sense to support the environment, support community and to support initiatives designed to benefit others," Sahabi said. "We are pleased to partner with them on this important effort."

GVI is a project of the Green Institute for Village Empowerment, (GIVE), a nonprofit organization established in 2005 to promote balance in the way people live, how their choices impact the environment and others in their community. GIVE hosts events and initiatives, and sponsors college campus events and sustainability, a term used to describe this social, economic and environmental balance.

In California Ex-Felons Can Vote

Undaunted by the heat, ex-felon Curtis Griffin spends his late summer afternoons walking Rialto and Fontana's bleakest neighborhoods on the hunt for ex-cons – each a potential voter who might cast the decisive ballot in the his-

toric November 4 national election. Finding them isn't the hard part, explains Griffin, it's getting them to admit that a past mistake has kept them from the ballot box.

"Most ex-felons out here are under the false assumption they can't vote. In California you can vote! There's a lot of misinformation and confusion out there."

That's an understatement, consider this: a 2001 U.S. Civil Rights Commission report concluded that the disenfranchisement of ex-convicts is "the biggest hindrance to Black voting since the poll tax."

The racial impact of racial disenfranchisement laws is particularly egregious. Thirteen percent of all Black men – 1.4 million cannot vote due to a patchwork of voting restrictions and the paralyzing grip of post Civil War Jim Crow laws. That represents just over one-third (36 percent) of the total disenfranchised population blocked from the vote even after they have completed their sentence and paid their debt to society: a rate seven times that of any other group in America.

The effects of voter disenfranchisement are universal except for Maine and Vermont, all states deprive individuals

with felony convictions of the right to vote for varying periods of time.


In California where the criminal justice system remains particularly rife with racial disparities, advocates like Griffin and nonprofits groups like Voting Rights for All are hard at work spreading the word: "In California ex-felons can vote."

Under California law, people with felony convictions can register to vote if they are out of prison (fully served their sentences) and off parole.

Although most of the state's voting

Obama Does Great in Polls – But Don't Believe Them

According to the polls, Barack Obama is steadily widening his lead over Republican rival John McCain to become the next president of the United States. A Washington Post-ABC News poll released Monday shows Obama with a 53 percent to 43 percent lead among likely voters.

There is only one problem – don't believe the polls.

As the Washington Post noted in a story on its poll, at this stage in 1992, Bill Clinton held a 14-point lead over President George H.W. Bush yet he won by only 6 percent. In mid-October 1976, Jimmy Carter held a 13-point lead over incumbent Gerald Ford but won by only two points.

When the issue of race is added to the mix, conventional wisdom – which is often neither conventional nor wise – goes out of the window.

Uppermost in the minds of African-Americans is the Bradley effect, named after former Los Angeles Mayor Tom Bradley, who sought to become governor of California in 1982. Even last-minute polls showed him leading by a wide margin of victory. Yet, Bradley narrowly lost the election to Republican George Deukmejian. Many say it was because

White voters lied to pollsters about their willingness to vote for an African-American.

But it wasn't just, as John McCain would say, that one.

Pre-election poll also overstated the margin of victory for Harold Washington in Chicago, David Dinkins in New York City and Doug Wilder in Virginia.

But Bradley's race predated the Internet and cell phones and before Black music did more to erase racial barriers than any presidential speech. In fact, there are an increasing number of people questioning the premise of the Bradley effect.

In a story headlined, "Do Polls Lie About Race?" New York Times reporter Kate Zernike wrote: "But pollsters and political scientists say concern about a Bradley effect – some call it a Wilder effect or a Dinkins effect, and plenty call it a theory in search of data – is misplaced. It obscures what they argue is the more important point: there are plenty of ways that race complicates polling."

"Considered alone or in combination, these factors could produce an unforeseen Obama landslide with surprise victories in the South, a stunningly large Obama loss, or a recount-thin margin. In a year that has already turned expectations upside down, it is hard to completely reassure the fretters."

Looking back, some observers say pollsters

got it wrong with Bradley not because White voters lied to pollsters, but because they failed to factor in the absentee ballots. Whatever the reason, some researchers think that's less likely to happen today.

According to the New York Times: "In a new study, Daniel J. Hopkins, a postdoctoral fellow at Harvard, considered 133 elections between 1989 and 2006 and found that Blacks running for office before 1996 suffered a median Bradley effect of 3 percentage points. Blacks running after 1996, however, performed about 3 percentage points better than their polls predicted."

As the debate continues about whether the Bradley effect is valid, the McCain camp continues to exploit the issue of race.

When Obama's name has been mentioned at McCain-Palin rallies, there have been cries of "Kill him!" and "Off with his head!"

It has gotten so bad that McCain has urged his followers to tone down the rhetoric. Away from rallies, however, his attack ads use code words to argue, as Palin put it, that Obama is "not one of us."

But observers have been able to see past the code words.

"From the start, there have always been two separate but equal questions about race in this election," Frank Rich wrote in the New York Times. "Is there still enough racism in America

to prevent a Black man from being elected president no matter what? And, will Republicans play the race card? The jury is still out on the first question until Nov. 4. But we now have the unambiguous answer to the second: Yes."

Rich explained, "McCain, who is no racist, turned to this desperate strategy only as Obama started to pull ahead."

He isn't the only person who feels McCain is playing to racial fears.

"Obama has been running as a post-racial candidate from the start, and he has been doing it very well," David Brinkley, a noted presidential historian told the New York Times. "But the fact of the matter is that some voters – we can't know yet how many – will not get past his race. And I very much believe that the McCain-Palin ticket is tapping into that."

And there is plenty to tap into. In that same New York Times article, John Schuster, a Republican from Wheeling, W.Va., said, "What you hear around here is, would you rather have a black friend in the White House, or a white enemy?" He explained, "Most guys I know are for McCain, and a lot of it's because of race."

No Voter Meltdown on Election Day

In recent years, the American people have endured all manner of natural and man-made disasters, including hurricanes, tornados, floods, droughts, fires and now an economic meltdown of epic proportions.

While some damage from these events is inevitable, the lack of government and citizen preparedness has increased the devastation caused by these calamities.

The \$700 billion bail-out package that was signed into law last week will hopefully fix some of the damage caused by Wall Street greed and lax government oversight. That bill was better than the Administration's original plan, but it is far from perfect and still does not do enough in our view to protect homeowners who are facing foreclosure. With the presidential election of 2008 less than

a month away, voters must ask themselves two important questions: First, which candidate has the best long-term solution for fixing our economy and helping American families and homeowners get back on their feet.

And second, are we prepared as citizens on November 4 to make our voices heard, stand up for our rights and make sure every vote is counted.

With foreclosures continuing to pile up and the loss of another 159,000 jobs in September, our country is facing the worst economic crisis since the Great Depression.

Wall Street may be breathing a sigh of relief because of the bailout package, but Main Street is still waiting to exhale. We will have our say on November 4th.

That's why the National Urban League is launching an unprecedented "Vote to Empower" campaign focusing on the urgent need for voter education, increased participa-

tion and the prevention of the kind of vote suppression that has occurred in the last two presidential elections.

We are demanding that all election officials uphold their duties and do what is necessary now and all the way to Election Day to prevent any infringements on voting rights.

We are calling on governors to verify that they have contingency plans for all foreseeable problems associated with the predicted massive turnout. And we are urging the President and both political campaigns to announce a zero-tolerance for voter suppression.

The National Urban League is ready to do its part. As a start, we are spotlighting areas of concern and issuing our first in a series of alerts and recommendations for citizen action. For example, in Michigan allegations have been made that foreclosure lists will be used to prevent citizens from voting. If true, this means that victims of foreclosure will lose their voting

rights. A lawsuit has been filed to prevent this from happening and we will continue to monitor the situation. Other potential suppression efforts across the nation are also being investigated.

Finally, it is important that you educate yourself about the voting rules in your state and report any potential problems such as lack of voting machines or voter intimidation.

The swift action taken to address the growing panic in the financial markets reminds us of the government's fundamental responsibility to take action to avert national catastrophes. On November 4, voters will have the last word. Preventing a voter meltdown in 2008 is just as important as preventing an economic meltdown.

Breast Cancer: Black Women Less Likely to Get It, More Likely to Die from It

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Millions of women are sporting pink ribbon pins in support of a month when organizations like the Susan G. Komen Foundation fundraise and galvanize people around the quest for a cure for breast cancer. They are right to raise awareness – more than 184,000 women will be diagnosed with breast cancer in the United States in 2008, and more than 40,000 will die from breast cancer.

While African-American women are less likely than White women to get breast cancer, we are more likely to die from it. The morbidity rate for White women is 9.4 per 100,000, compared to 15.4 per 100,000 for African-American women.

Additionally, African-American women often are diagnosed with breast cancer when they are younger, and when African-American women under 55 are diagnosed with breast cancer, it is more likely to have deadlier effects. Researchers are studying the reasons why African-American women are so much more vulnerable than other women are to breast cancer. But the findings make it important for African-American women to get regular mammograms and to deal with other aspects of our health.

Whenever there are health awareness weeks or months, whether they are for breast cancer, muscular dystrophy, diabetes, or another cause, I crave attention to the broader issue of health care and health access. We can take a slice out of the health care challenge by focusing, in October, on breast cancer, but the fact is that part of African-American women's increased vulnerability to breast cancer is a result of differential access to health care and health services.

Too many African-Americans lack health insurance. Too many wear the stress of racism in poor eating and living habits, and it shows up with obesity, high blood pressure, and the higher incidence of other diseases in our community.

African-American women are more likely than any other population, in 2008, to be diagnosed with HIV/AIDS. When another population was most likely to be diagnosed, HIV/AIDS awareness garnered headlines. Now, too many are silent about this disease, unless they are talking about the international incidence of HIV/AIDS.

It is not clear why our nation has not galvanized around the health care issue. To be sure, both presidential candidates have ideas about health insurance and health care; their plans are divergent. In my humble opinion, Hillary Rodham Clinton had one of the best health care plans we've seen in a long time, reflective of the work she has spent on health care since she worked on it as First Lady in the Clinton Administration.

Senators Obama and McCain would be advised to review her plan and incorporate aspects of it into their own work. Somehow, every American must have access to preventive health care, and protection from bankruptcy when they are diagnosed with expensive diseases. And somehow, as we raise awareness about breast cancer, we must also raise awareness about the ways breast cancer incidence is intertwined with the status of our health care system.

Breast cancer awareness has an international dimension. Hala Modellmog, President of the Susan G. Komen for the Cure, indicates that 10 million people will die in the next 25 years absent intervention around breast cancer. Last year, the Komen organization held a global advocacy summit in Hungary, and announced pilot programs in Eastern Europe, Latin America, Africa, and the Middle East. This month, they sent delegations to Ghana and Tanzania.

It is important to note that for all the challenges women face with breast cancer in the United States, health care access is even more limited in developing countries. The Komen organization is to be commended for their work in taking breast cancer global.

Back at home, though, the health care disparities that riddle our system are as present in

the realm of breast cancer and in other areas. Sisters must be among those sporting pink ribbons, but beyond the pink ribbons, we must all be passionate advocates for increased health care access, especially in the African-American community.






City Prepares For Upcoming Riverside Freeway Construction

RIVERSIDE

The high-occupancy vehicle (HOV) lane on the Riverside Freeway (State Route 91), between Tyler Street and Magnolia Avenue will be closed this weekend, Oct. 17-19.

Construction of the La Sierra Avenue overpass requires the closure of the freeway's eastbound and westbound HOV lanes from 8 p.m., Friday, until 5 a.m., Sunday.

Additionally, both eastbound and westbound No. 1 and 2 lanes will close from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Friday and Saturday nights.

La Sierra Avenue over the freeway will remain open during construction, although delays are expected. All businesses will remain open and accessible. Drivers should use alternate routes, such as Pierce, Magnolia or Tyler Streets, during the closures.

The \$38 million project will replace the La Sierra Avenue bridges over both the freeway and the railroad tracks with six-lane

bridges to reduce traffic congestion. New dual left-turn lanes onto the freeway will make it easier for vehicles to access the 91, while ramps will be widened from two to three lanes.

The project is expected to be completed by the summer of 2009.

sun-lit orange grove, circa 1930s. The drive-in was built on the site of an orange grove.

The vivid 42-by-60-foot mural will definitely be seen by drivers on Van Buren.

"We thought this would be a good way celebrate our 44th year in the same location -- to remind everyone of the citrus heritage in the neighborhood," said Manager Fred Williams, who has been the drive-in manager for 40 years.

The racy melodrama "The Carpetbaggers" awed Riverside audiences at the sold-out opening in July 1964 and, unlike other drive-ins, the Van Buren has been booming every since, Mr. Williams said.

As part of the celebration, vintage cars will parade to the theatre

at 10 a.m., Wednesday, starting from Arlington Park, 3860 Van Buren Boulevard. They will remain at the theatre until 1 p.m. The auto parade, featuring several auto collector societies in the area, is meant to bring back the memory of the drive-in heydays. Everything from a 1913 Model T to '60s Detroit steel will be on display.

"A lot of us remember when the whole family would jump into the car and go to the movies, said Councilmember Chris Mac Arthur, Ward 5, who solicited support from the auto societies. "This mural project reflects our commitment to preserving Riverside's small town feel and citrus heritage."



online donation for Barack Obama (her very first political contribution) to one of California's 166 delegates to the 2008 Democratic National Convention. Last month The Press Enterprise called Bailey a "rare challenger who would make a fine trustee".

But despite a glowing acknowledgment of the candidate, the newspaper handed its coveted endorsement to Figueroa and Takano.

Frustrating but all too familiar laments Ralph Rivers a Riverside activist and founding member of the Inland African-American Chamber of Commerce. Rivers ran unsuccessfully for RCC trustee in 1990.

"This kind of status quo mentality is an affront to people of color. African-American candidates who raise the issue of establishing a 'truly' multicultural board face a wall of criticism and even banishment. In Riverside there's this prevailing belief that to win a seat on the RCC board one must walk on water," claims Rivers

Rivers claims when he questioned board members about Black representation he was denounced and publicly accused of playing the race card. Today he likens his 90's campaign experience to the doubts dogging Obama. "Become president of the Harvard Law Review you're not good enough to become president. Dress a moose in record time and you're competent, experienced and vice presidential. This is what racism does. It covers up, rationalizes and minimizes positive qualities in one and emphasizes negative qualities in another when there is a color difference."

But the fact is says Rivers - years of conservative racial views played out at the ballot box have allowed the RCC board to systematically exclude a large swath of the population namely African-Americans.

All five members of the current RCC board live in Riverside. The lack of direct representation has stirred the simmering question of district representation.

Dell Roberts, a longtime Eastside Riverside resident, member of the RCC Foundation who consults with the Riverside Unified School District on issues of race says the absence of a Black board member and district representation begs an answer.

"The question of District representation in Norco-Corona and Moreno Valley particularly among African-Americans can't be answered with a 'no' answer. Changing people's attitudes has to start with a broad based commitment to inclusion followed by open honest dialogue," said Roberts.

"Who speaks for us?" says Roddie Dean whose backyard sits in the path of RCC's Moreno Valley campus. Black student enrollment at the campus is exploding - a reflection of the city's growing Black population and the region's increasing west to east migration. "African-



American students are growing in numbers - RCC unwilling to address the question of equal representation is not shy about spending Black tax dollars for new buildings and renovation - so what we have amounts to taxation without representation."

Bailey who enjoys support from liberals and conservatives and whose backyard sits in the shadow of RCC's Norco-Corona campus says race is not the biggest factor driving today's electorate.

"Not all whites are prejudiced. For so long what I've heard is 'this is a conservative Republican area'. I think that's changing for even those who wear that banner because of the overwhelming dissatisfaction with the Bush administration. People want change.

Now or later - eventually RCC will have to look at board term limits and expanded district representation."

"I'm not sure spending 12 or 18 years on the Trustee Board is in the best interest of the community and the students who are being served," said Bailey. "It is time for new and fresh voices that represent the needs of the students, faculty, staff and 'all' of the communities served by the District."

RCC's Mo Val campus will need to triple its numbers of classrooms, offices and labs in the next 15 to 20 years to address current shortages and projected growth, according to a plan outlined in April. Enrollment is expected to nearly double from 9,404 in the fall of 2006 to 17,154 by 2024.

Figueroa a longtime advocate for diversity who along with Bailey was endorsed by the Black Voice News says she's running for re-election to provide stability and to oversee a host of new projects at RCC, including a plan to transform Moreno Valley and Norco into separate colleges in addition to Riverside City College.

Ms. Figueroa, herself a minority says she knows that providing the best possible education ultimately benefits the local community and society overall but she takes issue with claims that RCC trustees would not welcome African-American members.

"We've done a lot to promote racial and ethnic diversity on the board. I think

you have to focus on the Riverside electorate. Traditionally Riverside County voters are conservative."

Takano meanwhile is seeking his fifth term to complete some unfinished business, including the proposed Riverside School of the Arts, the transition of a three-college district and the chancellor search.

"The district really needs an experienced board member who knows the ropes," said Takano, a high school English teacher.

Challenger Samuel Davis, a dentist, and an instructor at Cal Baptist University said he would bring a new perspective to the board particularly on the issues of student retention and choosing a new chancellor. "There is a population of students at RCC that are unrepresented. That must change."

Even the most conservative challenger will admit the November election comes at a pivotal time for what began in 1916 as a branch of Riverside Poly High School and feeder for students seeking a 4-year degree at UC Riverside. Viewed as an academic powerhouse RCC is ranked among the nation's 25 top community colleges, the state's third largest community college district with more than 33,000 students 33 percent of which are Latino and 11 percent African-American.

The district has been without a permanent chancellor for more than a year. Two nationwide searches have cost taxpayers nearly \$175,000, resulted in fierce board infighting and no applicant being selected. Critics argue that while taxpayer's dollars are being spent on searches that go nowhere, dropout rates among Latinos and Black students remain shamefully high.

Whatever the outcome of the RCC election Bailey backer RCC trustee and Riverside Obama organizer Jose Medina, believes the November election has been a chance for the local electorate to get in touch with their priorities and racial attitudes.

"The greatest change brought by the 2008 Elections may be America's perception about who we are. This is a watershed moment," said Medina. Even the younger generations now understand what it means to vote as a way to change America."

code was passed in 1974, these important legal rights have been mostly hidden, unspoken and unknown by the general public.

Last week during a Bible study at the Rock Church in San Bernardino, Melvin Stokes lamented about felons not having the right to vote.

"I've always wanted to vote... it has always been told to me that if you were convicted of a felony, you can't vote," said the ex-felon who has been off parole 10 years.

The misconception is not just among ex-felons. "I thought people convicted of felonies lost their right to vote. I see now it must be a common misconception," said a retired Alameda County judge, quoted in the San Francisco Chronicle, October 16, 2004.

To return to the ballot box, felons must negotiate suffrage laws that vary from state to state, in many cases working with election officials, parole officers and judges who can be both unfamiliar with the law and hostile to former

convicts seeking to register.

Such challenges matter little to Griffin and others trying to return former criminals to voter rolls, an effort they consider crucial in light of the results of the past two presidential elections: A shift of a few hundred votes in Florida in 2000 would have changed the outcome of the presidential race, and the results in 2004 came down to a margin of 119,000 votes in Ohio.

The nonprofits groups and individual activists making the push on felons' behalf agree the effort is broader this year than in previous elections. They expect the effort to benefit Barack Obama more than John McCain, given that the population of former felons is disproportionately Black.

Who Can Register?

A person entitled to register to vote must be a U.S. citizen, a resident of California, not in prison or on parole for the conviction of a felony, and at least 18 years of age.

You can vote after you have completed parole. There is no waiting period and you do not have to prove that you are off

parole. Election officials have access to parole status data. You can vote if you are on probation, or have completed probation. If you have been charged with a felony but not yet been convicted; If you have been convicted of a felony but are in county jail and not in state prison.

You must register by October 20. Pick up a registration form at your local library or post office. If you are in county jail, ask a friend or family member to pick up a form for you or request one through jail authorities.

Use your home address or your residence address. The registration form is a legal document that requires your signature and either a California driver's license/ID card number or the last four digits of your Social Security number. If you are not sure you are registered, voting officials encourage you to register again.

Culturally Competent Mental Health Care

Dear Dr. Levister: My father has a history of mental disorders. He refuses to get help, saying he does not trust doctors. Among Black people, is this a common problem? L.F.

Dear L.F.: Many Americans, including African-Americans, underestimate the impact of mental disorders. Many believe symptoms of mental illnesses, such as depression, are curses or "just the blues." Issues of distrust in the health care system and mental illness stigma frequently lead African-Americans to initially seek mental health support from non-medical sources.

One out of three Africans who need mental health care receives it. Compared to the general population, African-Americans are more likely to stop treatment early and are less likely to receive follow-up care.

Despite on going efforts to improve mental health services for African Americans and other culturally diverse groups, barriers remain in access to and quality of care from insurance coverage to culturally competent services.

For those with insurance, coverage for mental health services and substance use disorders is substantially lower than coverage for other illnesses such as hypertension and diabetes.

Contact the American Psychiatric Association and explain your father's illness and distrust of his doctors. Referral to an African-American mental health specialist may help.

Historically, mental health research has been based on Caucasian and European based populations, and did not incorporate understanding of racial and ethnic groups and their beliefs, traditions and value systems. Culturally competent care is crucial to improving utilization of services and effectiveness of treatment for these communities.

Culture, which is understood to be a combination of common heritage beliefs, values and rituals are an important aspect of racial and ethnic communities.

African Americans are a resilient people who have withstood enslavement and persistent discrimination to lead productive lives and build vibrant communities. Throughout U.S. history, the African American community has faced inequities in accessing education, employment, and health care. However, strong social, religious, and family connections have helped many African-Americans overcome adversity and maintain optimal mental health and well being.

Family Talks

Originally the scriptor classicus wrote for the upper Roman classes in the 2nd century AD and to them "Classic" meant "a first-class author of acknowledged excellence." Every feature of the ancient Greeks and Romans elite was expanded into the world of eminent authors. Those of ancient Romans were termed *Classici Auctores* (Classic authors)—i.e. authors of the best or first class because of their masterpieces having been declared to be Classic, Classics, or Classical. However, "Classic" should mean

nothing more than "belonging to a certain class." But by a process analogous to that whereby we say a person has "taste"—when we mean she has "good taste"—by common usage "Classic" came to refer to "belonging to the first class of excellence, the best." For scholars of the Middle Ages the best consisted of writings deemed worthy of preservation and study. During the Renaissance, "Classic" referred to the *Classical* ("the height of an achievement" in art or literature) in the sense of "a writer read in the classroom" (i.e. of an ancient author and not necessarily of first class). Throughout the Renaissance the high esteem in which ancient Greek and Latin, but especially Ancient African authors, was held bestowed on these authors the name "Classic."

At the end of the Renaissance, *Classical* was applied to serious or conventional music (as distinct from light or popular music). The period of the 18th century marked the devel-

opment of the symphony and the rise of such composers as Bach, Beethoven (a *malatto*), Brahms, Tchaikovsky, Handel, Haydn, and Mozart. In the Western world those who specialized in classical Latin were known as classical 'scholars'—not to be confused with the vastly different African speculative 'scholars.' The works studied, the subject itself, and the study of the subject took the label of the *Classics*—meaning first-rate works. Characteristics of such first rate *Classical* works were deemed to be: formal elegance, correctness, dignity, order, balance, unity, proportion, restraint, and "noble simplicity and quiet grandeur." Supposedly as a result, the *Classics of Art or Literature* are regarded as forming the basis of modern culture.

Today, *Classic, Classics, and Classical* refer to masterpieces of ancient cultures—the implication being that nothing can be taken away from or added to it without doing it

some injury. This determination is best made by Sages of all culture and certainly not by Europeans. *Classic* are works of acknowledged excellence and used as standards and foundations—or to establish them. 'Classic' points to the highest class—a standard of excellence—a perfect instance—the highest or pre-eminent excellence (e.g. Homer's *Iliad*). *Western Classics* point to works of great and lasting value; to the character of the author's achievement as authoritative, significant; and to great merit (based on wide agreement)—although it may have been superseded by some subsequent person. Because of its vagueness, "Classical" can apply to the *Classics*; to *Classicism*; to a way of thinking; or to a period of style (e.g. music, education) related to or typical of the Arts, Literature, and Culture of the ancient Greeks (400 to 350 BC) and Romans (50 BC to AD 50). *Classical Thought* is of enduring importance or significance; with a high stan-

dard of principles; and of simple and basic (i.e. rationality, objectivity, logic, and clarity) conclusions. *Classical Art* has balance, idealized beauty, and perfected form (i.e. form over content). Even though *Western Classic, Classics, and Classical* customarily refer to the Arts and Literature of ancient Greece and Rome, both the ancient Greeks and Romans borrowed their foundation and models from Ancient Africa. However, whereas *Europeans honor perfecting, elaborating, or expanding on lofty patterns of a Material World nature, Spiritually and Creativity are at the core of Africans' Classic, Classics, and Classical masterpieces.*

The popular weekly television news show, *Dateline* has a series called, "TO Catch a Predator," that I rate as a well intended but lukewarm effect sexual crime deterrent against children. The ongoing series aids law enforcement in catching Internet Chat Room adult male sexual predators;

however, it puts the safety and/or lives of the men in serious jeopardy by exposing them on national television. There are many people that like to take the law into their own hands when it comes to child molesters. Monterey Pours Jazz Into The Hearts And Souls Of Youth

Jazz begins at home and goes abroad, thanks to the educational and musical outreach programs presented by the Monterey Jazz Festival for talented teens looking for exciting edges and creative license.

The 51st annual Monterey Jazz Festival presented by Verizon kicked off a fall weekend of five concerts on eight Monterey County Fairgrounds stages with a concert for elementary and middle-school students.

The Thursday lunchtime pre-show featured the Berklee College of Music Latin Jazz All-Stars, an awesome ensemble with trumpeter Niv Toar, flutist Enrique "Kalani" Trinidad, pianist Abraham Olivo, bassist Juan Maldonado and percussionists Marcos Lopez and Paulo Stagnaro respectively on timbales and congas.

The weekend had too many little, annoying children - infants, toddlers, preschoolers and youngsters whose parents offered them nothing in terms of music education, respect for others and discipline. But youth in grade, middle and high schools who grasp the significance of jazz as an original American art form and love the improvisational nature of jazz played by masters were warmly welcomed by serious fans and artists.

Christian McBride, the former child prodigy and young lion musically mentored by Art Blakey, Ray Brown, Bobby Watson, Benny Green and Betty Carter, was a perfect choice for 2008 MJF artist-in-residence. His musicianship and pleasant personality helped fine tune talented teens in the Next Generation Jazz Orchestra, a conglomeration of young musicians judged to be the best in the United States and Canada by MJF legends, pioneers and masters.

McBride and master reed artist Paul Contos, who directs

the Next Generation, took the teens to newer and higher levels of showmanship and playing.

The magic of the music was not lost on Monterey High School singers Olivia Sedoryk and Edward Trout, violinist Sage Lang and acoustic bassist/cellist Athena Buell, all 14.

Active in school jazz, concert and classical ensembles, the four relished the Berklee Latin Jazz All-Stars performance and reflected on the reasons for their enthusiasm about jazz in general.

Hearing collegiate and master musicians "encourages us to practice, practice, practice because we hope to be as good as they are," Sage said. Monterey Jazz moments and musicians are "inspiring," added Athena.

"Most kids our age don't listen to jazz music," Olivia admitted. "Bringing in youngsters who haven't heard jazz before opens a new door for them to appreciate and maybe even play jazz."

Edward and Athena lamented the mediocrity of pop music today. They said they prefer jazz because it "is music from the soul," Athena explained. Edward said jazz brings together diverse people to share common interests.

The four said jazz breaks down barriers between people and broadens their world perspectives. Most people who are jazz fans tend to be more aware of humane issues and politically challenging concerns, they said, citing youth who put on a jazz benefit for children in Darfur victimized by genocide in Sudan.

"I wrote a song for Darfur. It was called 'Words Like Fire' and asked what has the world become if we don't save the kids in Africa," Sage said. "Words and music can light up the world, reconcile differences and end conflict. We need words, not war."

Musical words can promote peaceful action, Olivia claimed.

"That's right. Our little

school raised \$3,000 to buy school supplies and solar-powered stoves for children orphaned by genocide in Sudan and who live in the Darfur refugee camp," Athena reported.

Lela Hautau and her Pacific Grove Middle School girlfriends Cate Pfeiff, Mica McCloud and Laura Merchak cladded to the riveting rhythms of Latin jazz blasting from the stage. Other children couldn't sit still and gladly leaped up to dance as conga lines formed and weaved around equally enthusiastic young fans and their teachers.

One is never too young to get into music, continued 21-year-olds Toar and Olivo. Toar, started playing trumpet at age 8 while Olivo's piano lessons began when he was 9 years old.

Olivo focused on classical music, theatrical and visual arts and dance until he discovered jazz while attending Boston Arts Academy, a public school for students involved in the performance and visual arts.

"That's when I started not minding practicing for a few hours," Olivo said. "Jazz, unlike classical music which emphasizes the composers more, allows musicians to develop their own techniques, find their own voice and be recognized for it. Chopin is great, but so is Coltrane. And you don't hear Trane's name each time an artist plays one of his compositions."

After successfully auditioning for the only arts' high school in Israel, Toar shifted from the strict structure of classical music to jazz so he could expand his musical horizon and find greater self-expression. He went to Berklee on a full-ride scholarship and graduated last May.

Toar and Olivo said it was exciting and inspiring to see youth turned on to their performances in much the same way they respond to musicians older than them.

"It's great to see young people enjoying music as complex and sophisticated as jazz," Toar concluded.


