PRESS STATEMENT.FROM THE PREMIER (MR. DUNSTAN).

The South Australian Government has agreed to subsidise on a one for one basis up to a maximum of \$1,250 the cost of developing the Memorial Park at Bordertown, the Premier and Minister of Development (Mr. Dunstan) announced today.

Mr. Dunstan said that the developments planned by the District Council of Tatiara included a boating lake, road works, car park, tree planting and fencing.

He said the park will provide picnic facilities in pleasant surroundings, adjoining the swimming pool and bowling greens, tennis courts and other sporting facilities in the area.

"It is expected that the work will be completed by April, 1971.

"The Government is pleased to subsidise the work in line with its overall policy of encouraging the development of tourist and community facilities in the country areas."
