PRESS RELEASE FROM THE PREMIER, MR. DUNSTAN.

SUBJECT: EXECUTIVE COUNCIL APPOINTMENTS.

9/2/71.

Executive Council today appointed Mr. Robert David Eavestaff Bakewell Director of the Premier's Department.

Mr. Bakewell, 44, is presently a Commissioner of the Public Service Board.

Married with three children, Mr. Bakewell has Bachelors Degree in Economics from London University.

He lives at St. Peters.

Prior to becoming a Commissioner, Mr. Bakewell was with the Commonwealth Public Service in Canberra, working in policy development areas.

Mr. Bakewell will be responsible for the overall direction and co-ordination of policy in the Department of the Premier and Development.

He will take up his appointment on the 4th January, 1972.

Mr. J.S. White, Secretary of the Department, will take special responsibility for the Administration Branch of the Department of the Premier and Development.

Public Service Board.

Executive Council today appointed Mr. Graham Jack Inns a Commissioner of the Public Service Board.

He is expected to take up his appointment on the 14th February:

Mr. Inns, 35, is presently Senior Public Service Inspector (Industrial and Arbitration) to the Public Service Board of Papua-New Guinea, and is chief adviser to the Board on industrial relations in the Territories.

Mr. Inns, Adelaide born, was educated at State Schools and Adelaide University, where he obtained a B.A. Degree.

He has a Diploma in Public Administration, and is now completing an M.A. Thesis for the University of Papua-New Guinea.

Prior to taking up his position in Papua-New Guinea Mr. Inns was Assistant Secretary of the Public Service Association of South Australia.
