NEW SERVICE FOR HENLEY BEACH AREA

A new bus service could be operating in the Henley Beach area about April next year.

The House of Assembly Member for Henley Beach and Minister of Environment and Conservation (Mr. Glen Broomhill) said today planning for the new service was well underway.

Mr. Broomhill said the Minister of Transport (Mr. Geoff. Virgo) had told him this week that the Government had agreed to help the Woodville Council construct two roads to a standard suitable for bus traffic.

The roads are Cheadle Street at Fulham Gardens and Valetta Road at Kidman Park.

"The Government believes that the provision of a new bus service in these areas is essential in view of the rapidly developing residential area of Fulham Gardens."

"Construction of the roadways will begin as soon as possible to enable the service to be introduced about April next year."

Mr. Broomhill said the Government would also help the Woodville Council finance the construction of Bremner Drive at Football Park.

"This roadway will be used specifically for bus services taking football followers to and from Football Park."

"The exclusive use of this road by buses should result in fast travelling times in and out of the park."
