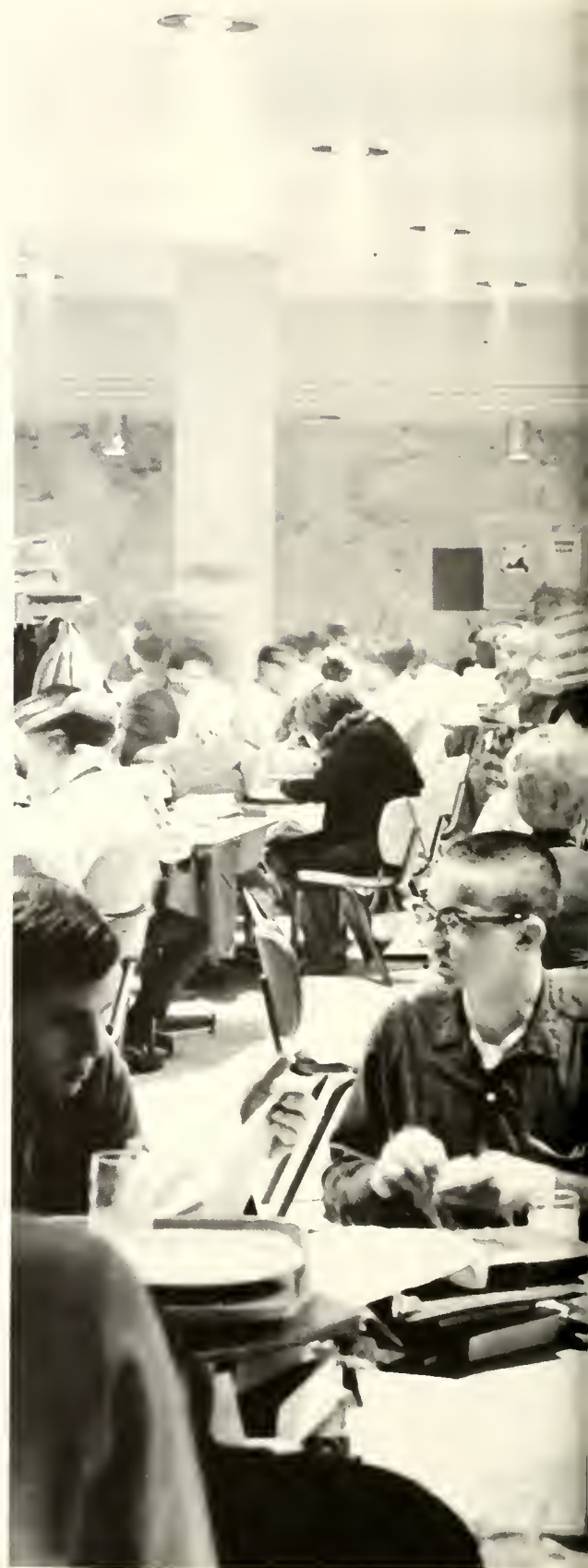

worker, scholar, kid

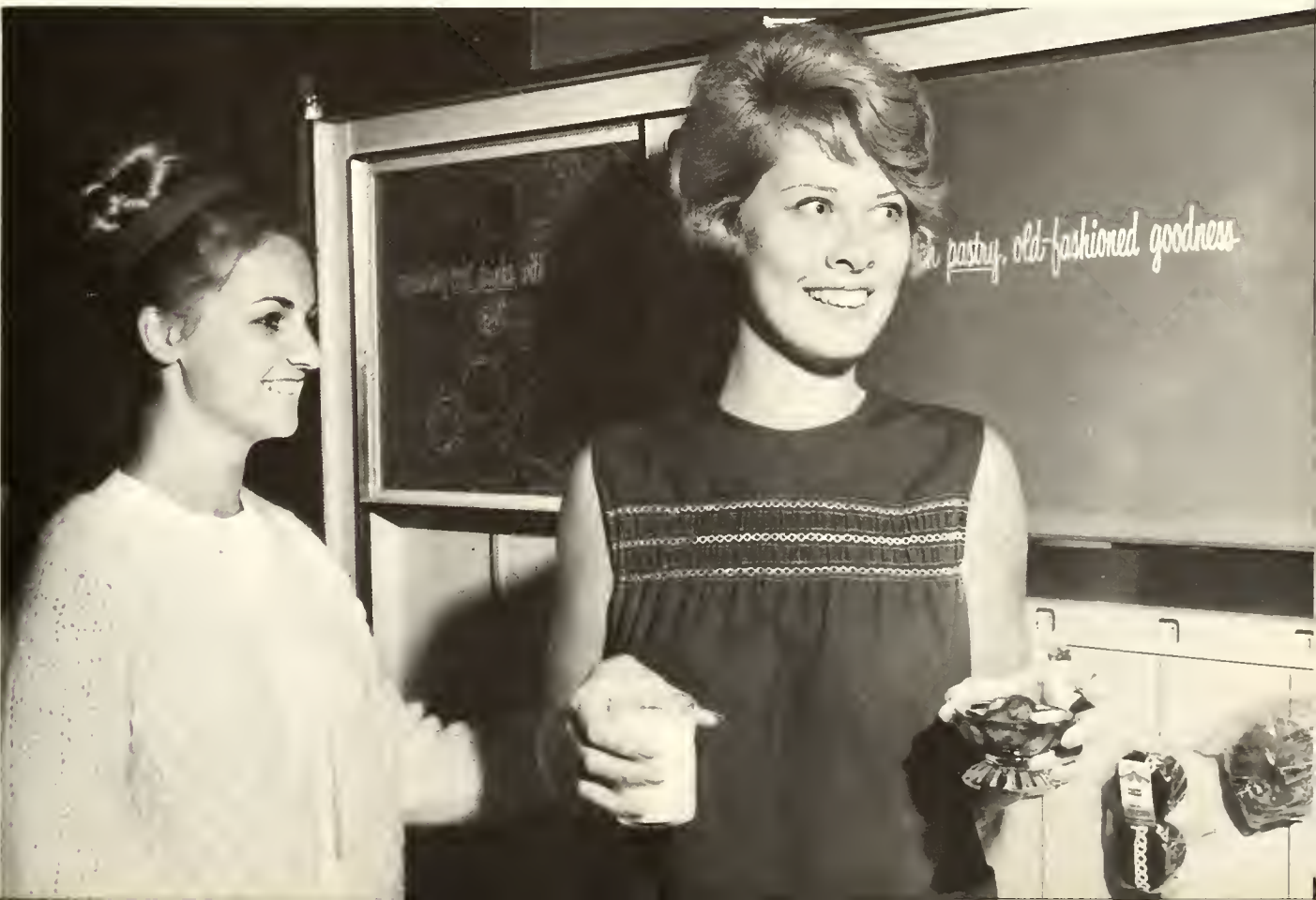
everything moves faster

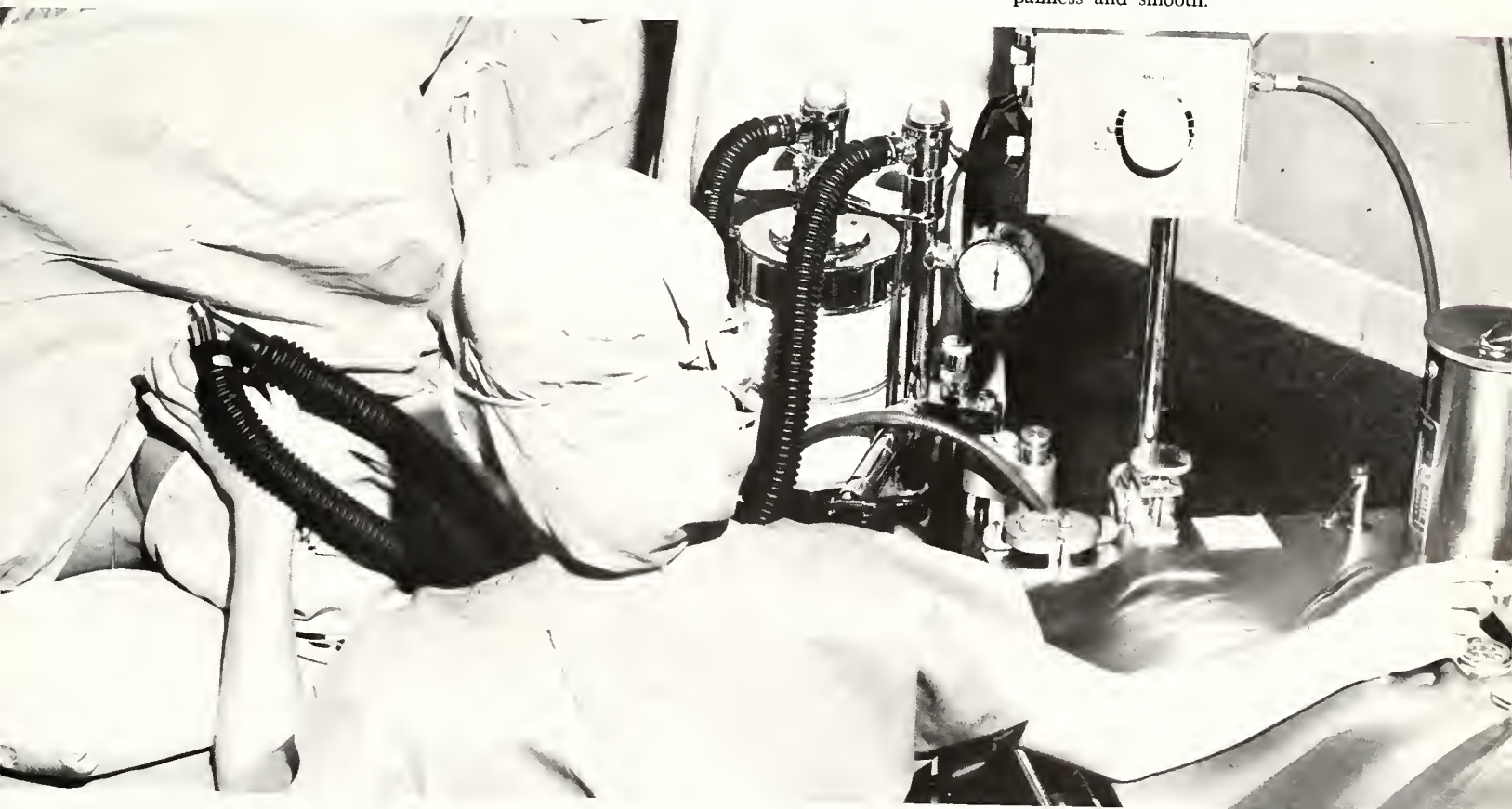

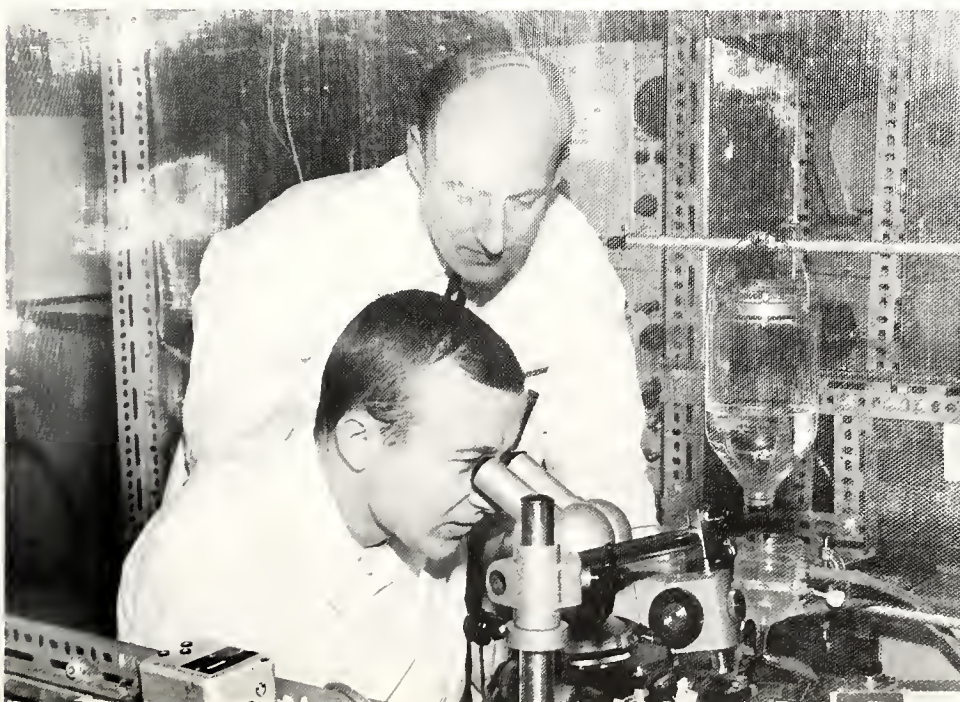
