

Communication of scientific information is one of the most important aspects of developing and sustaining a successful research career. This session is designed to provide information that will help scientists prepare and publish the results of their research. It will start with short talks on when to begin writing, how to choose a journal, including a presentation on impact factors and other criteria for judging journal quality, how to deal with issues of authorship, and other related topics. A key feature of the session will be the participation of a panel of journal editors, representing publications in the field of developmental biology. Panel members will present their views on what their journals are looking for when evaluating papers. A Q&A session with all speakers and panel members will follow the presentations. Attendees are encouraged to bring questions and to participate in the discussion.
